

1. When waiting for the bus, stay away from traffic, avoid roughhousing and do not stray onto streets.
2. Line up away from the street or road as the school bus approaches. Wait until the bus has stopped and the door opens before stepping onto the roadway.
3. Use the hand rail when stepping onto the bus.
4. When on the bus, find your seat and sit down immediately. Never put head, arms, or hands out of the window.
5. Keep aisles clean of books or school bags and do not block the aisle.
6. Before you reach your stop, get ready to leave by getting your books and belongings together.
7. At your stop, wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from your seat. Then, walk to the front door and exit, using the hand rail.
8. If you have to cross the street in front of the bus, walk at least ten steps ahead of the bus along the side of the road, until you can turn around and see the driver. Make sure that the driver can see you. Wait for a signal from the driver before beginning to cross the street. When the driver signals, walk across the road, keeping an eye out for sudden traffic changes.
9. Stay away from the bus rear wheels at all times.
10. Students should wear outer garments that have no drawstrings, toggles, straps, sashes or belts that hang loosely. Avoid loose-fitting coats and capes, and oversize or baggy clothing. Purchase backpacks that fit snugly against your child's body.
