

Kindergarten Readiness Checklist

Welcome, future Panthers! Before your child starts Kindergarten, here's a helpful checklist in addition to the <u>Kindergarten Website</u> to make sure you are fully prepared for a smooth and successful start:

	Registration and Enrollment		
	 Complete online registration through the school district website. Submit required documents: birth certificate, immunization records, and proof of residence. Custody/Court Order if a student lives with someone other than those named on the birth certificate. Sign up for ParentSquare (our communication tool). Use the email address you used for enrollment. 		
	School Supplies		
	 Watch for the Kindergarten supply list this summer and have materials ready before the first day. Ensure your student has a normal-sized backpack (not preschool size) that can fit a full-size folder or notebook. 		
	General Things to Do		
	 Label everything, especially hoodies and cardigans (our most unclaimed items). Ensure your child knows how they get home after school daily (walk, bus, car pick-up). If you want to volunteer at any school event, field trip, or class activity, complete the volunteer paperwork and read the handbook. Ensure your student has a backup change of clothes in their backpack. 		
/	Health and Safety		
	 Complete health forms if your child has allergies, medications, or medical needs. No medicines are allowed at school without a doctor's order being filed with the school. This includes any over-the-counter medications. Schedule and complete any needed immunizations before the first day of school. Ensure your student is up-to-date on vaccinations or has a valid exemption on file to attend school. Practice handwashing, covering sneezes, and basic hygiene habits. 		

V	ily Readiness Skills
	Practice independently putting on and taking off coats, backpacks, and shoes. Practice independently buttoning and zipping pants and coats Have your child practice independently opening snacks, lunch items, and water bottles. Build stamina for sitting and listening for short periods (story time practice is excellent!). Practice going to places that have toilets with automatic flushers. Ensure your child can take care of their toileting needs and hygiene independently.
V	ademic Readiness
	Encourage them to recognize and write their name. Practice counting to 10 and recognizing some numbers and letters. Practice rhyming, swapping out sounds in words, riddles, and nursery rhymes. V	cial and Emotional Skills
	Practice taking turns, sharing, and asking for help when needed. Help your child recognize and talk about their feelings. Encourage using polite words like please, thank you, and excuse me. V	nool Routines
	Talk about morning and bedtime routines to support a consistent school schedule. Practice getting ready in the morning with enough time to be at school on time. Kindergarten attendance is a crucial part of your child's educational success. Please schedule vacations on breaks and appointments outside of the school day.
