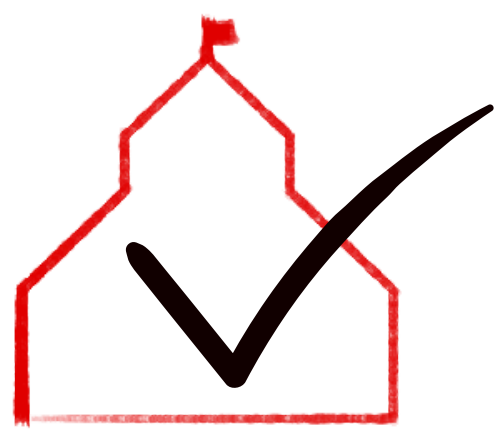


Continuous, Review, Evaluation, and Weeding of Materials in FISD

Just Weed It!



Misleading:

Books that contain inaccurate, outdated, or misleading information should be removed to avoid confusion or harm to readers.



Ugly:

Physically damaged books that are beyond repair or rebinding should be weeded out, as they are no longer aesthetically pleasing and may be more difficult to use.



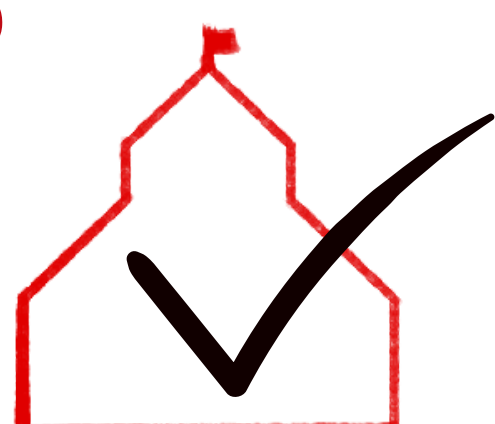
Superseded:

If a newer, more comprehensive, or better-written edition of a book exists, the older edition can be weeded.



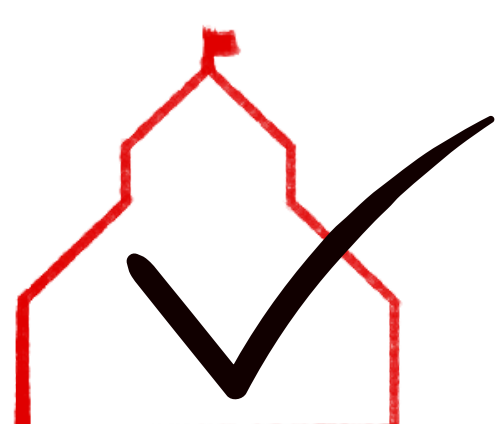
Trivial:

Books that have little literary or scientific merit, or are not widely used or relevant to the library's community, may be considered for weeding.



Irrelevant:

Books that are no longer relevant to the library's community or its specific interests may be weeded.



Elsewhere:

If the same information is readily available in other formats (e.g., online, interlibrary loan), the physical copy may be weeded.
