The Reception children went on their School trip to Odds farm where the children thoroughly enjoyed seeing and learning about all the animals and how a farm runs. They took part in lots of fun activities including a tractor ride and feeding some of the animals . It's the turn of our year 3 and 4's to head off on their residential trip next week to Grittleton which is always a highlight of the school year. With only two weeks to go until the May half term we have lots to fit in before the second half of the summer term arrives, hopefully with it some continued good weather! LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 have really enjoyed starting fractions this week. The children have been learning about half and know that half is two equal parts. They have enjoyed identifying half of a shape and half of an amount.

Ask me: What is half of an amount?







Year 2 have been continuing their work on fractions this week. They have been working on recognising fractions up to three quarters. In History Lessons they have learnt about famous monarchs his week, they have used this learning to help them understand why each of the monarchs are significant people. They have also enjoyed using the Glockenspiels in music and recapping the features of a Mosque in their RE learning as they learnt all about wudu. They have been using their computer skills on a program called Scratch to create their own "Knock Knock" Jokes. Scratch is a program where you can create your own interactive stories, games and animations.

Ask me: Tell me your own knock knock joke.







Year 3 have had a busy week. They have been learning about Hinduism during RE, they have enjoyed creating Rangoli patterns and learning about how Diwali is celebrated. We have been learning about money during our Maths lessons converting pounds and pence. We have also been learning about Queen Boudicca during our topic lessons.

Ask me: What is the special flower in the Rangoli pattern?



Year 4 continued with money in Maths and have been developing their trading skills. We have been impressed with their money changing and negotiating skills during the game. In Art, the children created an Islamic art star design, making a template by tracing and cutting out a star as well as painting a background to cut the stars out of. They have also completed some clay work, which will be painted next week. They have focussed on relief work, using slip to add shapes to their clay tiles. This is a skill they used previously with their Bankura horses.

Ask me: How do you make and use slip and what is it for?



Reception had lots of fun visiting Odds Farm this week. We had some workshops where we learnt about different breeds of rabbits and goats and saw a how cows are milked. We enjoyed stroking and feeding the animals and then had a picnic outside and a tractor ride.

Ask me: What was your favourite part of the trip?
