

Summer Reading 2025

English 1 Honors (Course #117)

Students will read two (2) books over the summer. You should read the required book and one (1) book from the suggested list.

Required book: *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee

For each book, you will choose an activity to complete. Below are three activities to choose from: *Five Journal Responses, Create a PPT, or a Reading Response Web.*

Please review each activity and choose one activity to complete for To Kill A Mockingbird by Harper Lee and choose one activity to complete for the book you choose from the suggested list. (Activities will be collected or emailed to the teacher the first week of school.)

Students will take an in class assessment on *To Kill a Mockingbird* at the beginning of the school year. That assessment will be combined with activities that the student completes over the summer for a test grade.

Activity #1-Five (5) Journal Responses

(Type in a Word or Google document or clearly write in a notebook)

Directions: Date & label each response.

Respond to the questions below to review the novel.

Write/type **100-150 words** for EACH response.

Journal #1:

Describe the characters introduced and setting (time and place) of the novel.

Who is in the novel? Where does it take place? How are the characters related? Are you familiar with the setting?

Journal #2:

What conflict or problem is the main character (or main characters) facing in the novel?

Predict how you think this problem may be dealt with by the main character(s) or others in the novel.

How would you deal with the problem?

Journal #3:

What do you think or feel about the situation that the main character (or main characters) is/are going through?

What have you seen or read that relates to the problem?

How does the problem relate to you or teens today?

Journal #4:

After reading the book, reflect upon and explain how one of the main characters grows/changes from the beginning of the novel to the end of the novel?

Journal #5:

What is the overall message the author is trying to express to young adults?

Activity #2 Create a PowerPoint

(May be completed in Google Slides or in PowerPoint)

Create your own original six-slide PowerPoint or Google Slideshow to review and share the novel. Use the guidelines below:

Slide guidelines:

Slide 1: Title and author of book (Include an image.)

Slide 2: Main Character – Write the main character’s name AND write at least 50 words to describe the character.

Slide 3: Setting – Write where and when story takes place (Include an image.)

Slide 4: The Conflict – Write 100 or more words about the problem/conflict the main character faces AND how the character deals with this conflict.

Slide 5: The Theme – What is one theme (the overall or underlying message) of the novel? What does the author wants us to know or realize by writing about this theme? (100 words)

Slide 6: Summary & Opinion – Give a summary of the story *AND* your opinion of the story. (Write 100 or more words.)

Activity #3 Design a Reading Response Web

(You may use poster board, index cards, etc. or create it in a Word or Google document or whatever format you are creative in). **Create, design, or draw a Reading Response Web to review and respond to the novel. (See examples below). This activity should have the following:**

1. **Title:** Title of book AND author’s name
2. **Picture:** A drawing or image of the book
3. **Main character:** Name of main character WITH 3 words to describe him/her.
4. **Setting:** Where is the setting of the story is located? – Include an image or drawing.
5. **Summary:** Type or write a summary of the problem in the novel and how it is resolved. (Write 100 words.)
6. **Favorite Event:** Explain your favorite event of the story and why it is your favorite. (Write 50 words.)
7. **Surprise Event:** Explain one thing/event that surprised you in the novel and why you are surprised by it. (Write 50 words.)
8. **Recommendation:** Explain why or why not you would recommend this book. (Write 50 words.)
9. **Include your name.**
