- ★ Previous School records

 - Once your students cumulative records folder is received from their previous school the information will be audited. You may then be contacted to forward your students birth certificate and/or social security card to Mrs Martin.





Parent Portal what is it? How can I get it?

- Parent Portal is a secure online portal for parents to access grades, assignments and attendance.
- It is a 2-way communication tool for parents and teachers
- You can receive email alerts of absences and grades.

- ★ Make sure you are on Parent Sign In. Your student will have their own account.
- ★ If you already have an account but can't remember your password contact Mrs Martin and she can reset it for you.
- ★ If you are creating an account and need your *access ID* and *access password* you will need to get these from your main office or Mrs Martin.

Attendance and Truancy

Attendance is mandatory as per the Education Code 25.085

Notes should be handed in to your school office within 3 days of your students absence

TRUANCY PREVENTION MEASURES (TPM'S)

- ★ Beginning of the Year Notice
- ★ Tier I - General Attendance Agreement Pledge (GAAP)
- ★ Tier II – 3 Unexcused Absences within a 4-week period
- ★ Tier III – 5 unexcused absences within a 6-month window
- ★ Tier IV – 7 unexcused absences within a 6-month window
- ★ Legal Intervention – 10 unexcused absences within a 6-month window

WARNING NOTICE DISTRIBUTION

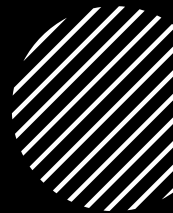

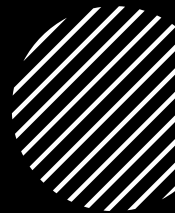

Dual Credit Expectations

1.

Information

Dual Credit courses are offered in a variety of subject areas including math, science, English, economics, history, government and a wide variety of technical courses. Classes meet on ECC campus or the high school campus and are taught by college faculty or qualified high school instructors.

Dual Credit academic courses are transferable to all Texas public colleges and Universities as well as many private and out-of-state institutions. Students planning to transfer to a private or out-of-state college or university should check with the receiving school to confirm transferability of credits from El Centro College.

2.

Cost

Tuition is currently waived for courses that are considered dual credit. Students receive both high school and college credit for the course(s) they successfully complete.

If a student takes a course for concurrent credit, the tuition is not waived. Concurrent credit refers to enrollment for which the student receives college credit only.

If courses are taken at the college campus, students must purchase their college textbooks and any other materials that are needed for the college course. For courses that are offered here at the School of Health Professions, the books are provided to the students.

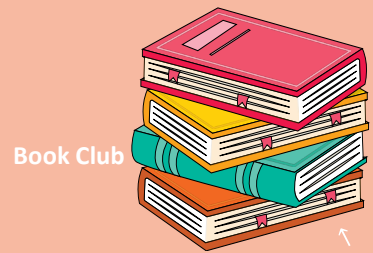

Hats, Head Coverings, Shirts, Blouses	Shirts should be school appropriate and cover to the shoulder and the waistline. Sleeveless shirts should be 2" in width on the shoulders. Ball caps, beanies, and head coverings that are religious in nature may be worn in the building.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Spaghetti strap/ Off Shoulder shirts ● Crop-tops/ Backless shirts ● Low cut neck/chest ● Tank tops ● Shirts, hats, beanies with derogatory messages/ images, profanity, explicit content, controversial, promotion of drug/alcohol use or advertisement ● No hoodies and/or bandanas worn on head ● No hair bonnets and wave caps
Pants, Jeans, Leggings	Full length and capri length pants and jeans are acceptable. Pants must be worn at the natural waistline. Leggings may be worn if they are non-see through and covered by a skirt or shirt that covers to finger-tip length.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Tights substituted for leggings/pants ● Distressed jeans with holes/tears higher than finger-tip length ● Pajama bottoms
Skirts, Dresses, Shorts	Skirts, dresses, and shorts length should be finger-tip length or longer.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Skirts, dresses, shorts shorter than finger-tip length
Shoes	Shoes must be worn at all times. Appropriate shoes include athletic tennis shoes, loafers/dress shoes, and closed-heel sandals. Crocs may be worn with a strap behind the heel.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Flip-flops ● Slides ● House shoes/ Slippers ● Open toed shoes
School ID Badges	School ID badges must be worn in a visual place at all times. Lanyards and/or clips should be used.

TMC Dress Code Policy

You may put them in your purse, book bag, pocket, or any other location in which it will not be seen. If either of the devices are seen, the following actions will ensue:

1st – Warning: If your device is seen the first time, you will be asked to put it away (out of sight).

2nd – If your device is seen the second time, the teacher will collect it and return it when the class period has ended.

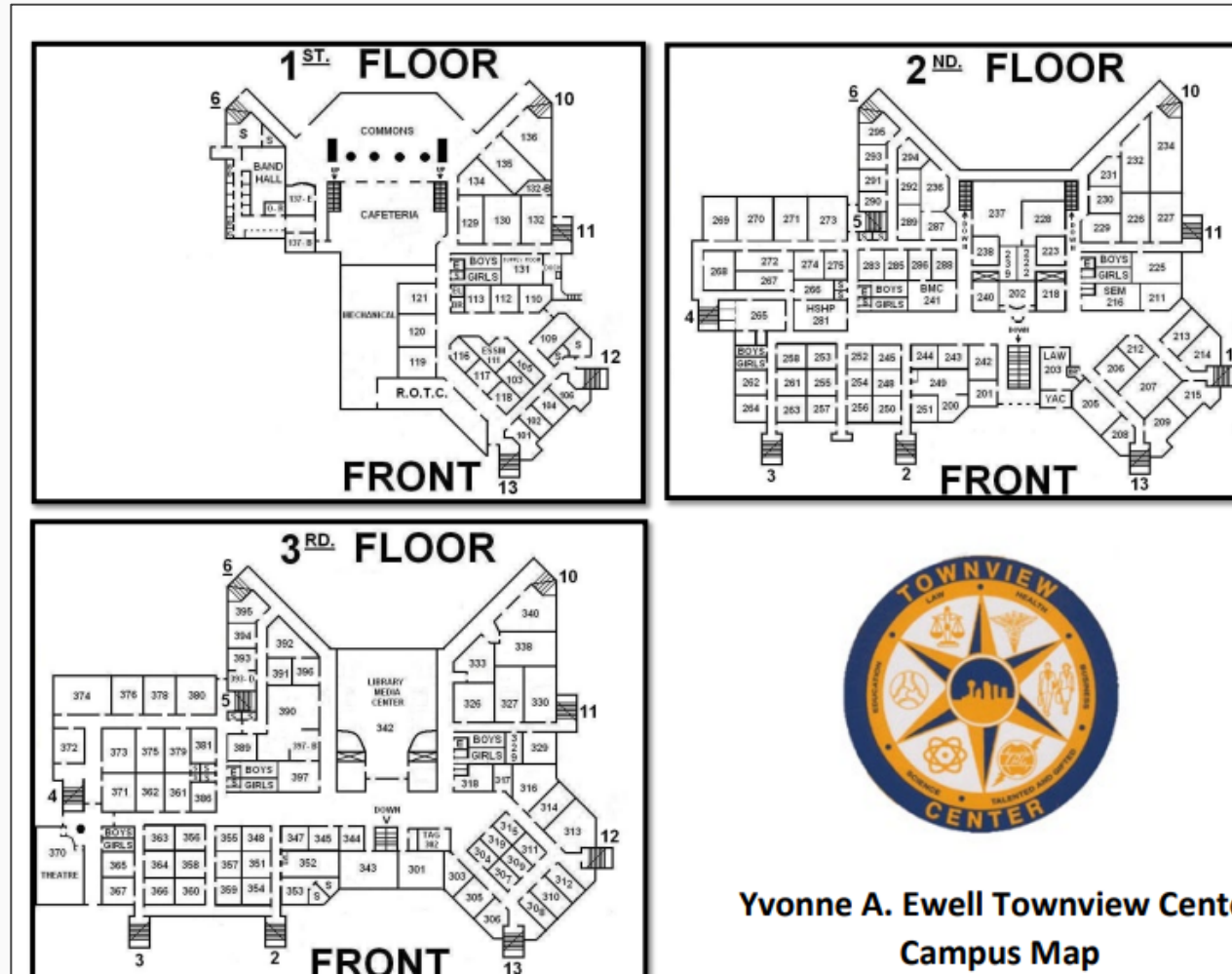
