### 4. 2024-2025 Budget Status Update

Associate Head of School for Finance and Operations Susi stated that the year had begun smoothly and without many surprises so far. Comments during the detailed revenue report included timely payments from the sending towns, training STRIVE and special education students to ship items from the school store, and that money from the fall athletic fees should be received in the next 3-4 weeks. During the detailed expense report section, it was noted that the tax credits from the Academy Project were expected to arrive in the next three weeks; plans are in place to sell them immediately. Other highlighted categories included school physician fees, pupil transportation, food service, and maintenance projects such as the Cutler House and the punch list from the Academy Building Project. When the balance sheet was reviewed, a few questions were asked and answered.

## 5. 2023-2024 Audit Update

Associate Head of School for Finance and Operations Susi shared that documents continue to be provided to the auditors.

### 6. October 1, 2024, Enrollment

Associate Head of School for Finance and Operations Susi said that the October first numbers for the sending towns show special education numbers to be nearly the same as last year. The number of total students from the sending towns has been lowered by 14 students. Sending town trends indicate several more years of declining numbers followed by a bounce back upward.
