3. Secretary's Report—Minutes of May 8, 2024

4. Welcome New Members

5. School-wide Goals/Initiatives

Dean of Student Affairs Karin Hughes informed the group that since artificial intelligence (AI) is part of our school-wide goals, additional effort would be expended to support its responsible use by students and adults this year. A brief discussion ensued. Once the speaker grants permission, the recent PD presentation will be shared with student life committee members.

6. Freshman Forum

Dean of Student Affairs Karin Hughes introduced math teacher Cassie Olson and social studies teacher Connor Elliott, who are helping coordinate this year's Freshman Forum. Freshman Forums are meant to provide a better onboarding, integration, and engagement experience for the freshmen class. The series is held during the first half of community lunch for the first five weeks of school. Mrs. Olson and Mr. Elliott used a PowerPoint presentation to provide greater details as to the topics each week. Broad discussion ensued. While positive changes are being seen in discipline, participation, engagement, and the overall school climate, a staff survey is planned to gather additional data.

Mrs. Olson and Mr. Elliott exited the meeting at 7:37 p.m.

7. Changes to Student Handbook

Dean of Student Affairs Karin Hughes provided additional information about the more significant changes to the student handbook.

- Social Probation—Students on social probation will need to be in a designated area during community lunch, such as the library, a help room, a club meeting, or in a classroom with a teacher.
- Credit Loss Policy Changes—Credit loss will be tracked using unexcused absences from an individual
 course rather than by daily attendance. More than nine unexcused absences from an individual course will
 result in credit revocation and an appeal process. A meeting will be held with the student, parent/guardian,
 school counselor, administrator, and support services member by the seventh unexcused absence to
 determine appropriate interventions.

• Community Lunch Updates—Expectations and restrictions have been more clearly spelled out for students to access the South Campus, dormitories, and the defined boundaries of the school campus.

8. Other

The concept of restorative justice continues to be a focus this year. The most recent NEAS&C report will be shared with the committee.
