Executive Summary:

Each year Pearland ISD students participate in Advanced Placement (AP) exams. For the 2024 – 2025 school year, the cost of each exam is \$99.00. Students and their parents pay most of the cost. The College Board provides a \$37.00 fee waiver for each student who qualifies for free and reduced lunch. TEA also provides an additional \$27.00 for each student who qualifies for free and reduced lunch. Advanced Academics has budgeted funds to decrease the cost to parents at a subsidy of \$20.00 per exam resulting in a total district subsidy of \$145,129.00. Due to the external support, this year's district subsidy for students who qualify for free/reduced lunch is \$10.00, bringing the cost per exam for students who qualify for free/reduced lunch to \$25.00.

There is an exception for the AP Capstone program courses, AP Seminar and AP Research. Because the AP Capstone courses require a portfolio submission, a group collaboration component, a thesis style paper, a presentation and oral defense, and multiple exam-related milestone dates throughout the year, the cost of each Capstone exam is \$147.00 (\$83.00 for free/reduced lunch students). Due to the nature of the work performed in AP Capstone classes, AP Seminar and AP Research are the only classes where students are required to take the exam, and the district pays the entire cost.

The total cost for AP exams for Pearland ISD as of April 23, 2025 is \$523,972.00. Additional fees for students who take a late exam or who do not take the exam may be charged to the student's campus, and students are required to pay any additional fees not covered by the cost of their exams.

All funds have been budgeted or collected, so new funds are not required. Because the single purpose cost exceeds \$100,000, board approval is needed.

Executive Summary:

In accordance with Texas Education Code Section 44.031(h), school districts may bypass standard competitive procurement procedures / Request for Proposals (RFP) process in the event of an emergency that affects the public health or safety of students and staff, or that requires immediate action to prevent operational disruption.

Critical components of the District building's elevator and fire alarm systems have been discontinued by the manufacturer, making repairs impossible. As a result, the systems are no longer reliably serviceable, which poses significant safety concerns for students and staff. The inability to maintain these systems at full operational readiness creates serious risks related to accessibility, emergency response, and code compliance.

Administration is recommending that the Board of Trustees authorize the execution of an emergency procurement to address the immediate safety and operational concerns related to the following elevator rebuild/ modernization and fire alarm system upgrade:

Executive Summary: Request for Proposal (RFP) #25-0219-1 was issued to acquire proposals from vendors for Workers' Compensation Insurance. The RFP was advertised in accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC) Ch. 44.031 and automatically sent to all corresponding vendors registered on our electronic bidding system. Invitations were extended to 433 potential proposers; 6 proposals were received; the top 2 proposals went to a final round, where a Best and Final offer was requested.

The District recommends awarding the contract for Workers' Compensation Insurance to TASB Risk Management Fund. Administration has been pleased with the services provided by TASB Risk Management Fund in the past and would like to award TASB again for a contract period effective July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026. This contract also has 4 additional one-year renewal options. The cost decrease of \$59,899 or 12.31% for fiscal 2025-2026 is based on changes in payroll levels and loss history.

Executive Summary:

The School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) is composed of a parent representative from each campus, nominated by principals and approved by the Board of Trustees. There are also four student representatives – one from each high school. In addition to seven (7) community representatives, the district representatives include Federal Programs/Grants Administrator Donna Tate, PE Coordinator Isabel Gomez, Assistant Athletic Director Laneigh Clark, Food Service Director Dorothy Simpson, Food Service Dietitian Ann Shetler, School Health Coordinator Monica Reynolds, District Lead Nurse Sherrie Mullikin, Coordinator of Guidance Services Chenda Moore, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction Dr. Charles Allen, Director of Safe and Secure Schools John Palombo, and Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Lisa Nixon. There were four (4) SHAC meetings scheduled for the 2024 – 2025 school year: September 23, November 4, February 3, and April 14. The SHAC Meeting Agendas, Meeting Minutes, and Audio Recordings for each meeting can be found on the district website – <u>Pearland ISD Councils/Committees.</u>

September 23, 2024

At the September 23, 2024 meeting of the Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC), members were welcomed and introduced, and Dr. Nixon provided an overview of SHAC's advisory role in promoting student health and wellness. The meeting focused on school safety, including a recent Texas Education Agency vulnerability assessment, which praised district safety efforts. Dr. Nixon reviewed the district's Behavioral Threat Assessment and Safe and Supportive School Program Team procedures and emphasized the importance of threat reporting and parent communication. Future topics were explored through member feedback, and updates were shared about upcoming events like the Fentanyl Awareness session and "Coffee with the Counselors" workshops. November 4, 2024

At the November 4, 2024 meeting of the Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC), members focused on student mental health, following feedback from a prior survey. School counselors from various campuses participated in the meeting, sharing strategies and challenges related to supporting students' mental well-being. Dr. Moore led interactive activities and discussions to promote open dialogue, including a guided reflection on perceptions of mental health, barriers to support, student needs, and community roles. A panel of counselors provided insights from their campuses, and the meeting concluded with interest in exploring topics related to social media and digital safety at future sessions. February 3, 2025

At the February 3, 2025 meeting of the Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC), members explored student social media use, a topic identified by parents as a key concern. Dr. Laura Reeves, Director of Instructional Technology, presented "Parents' Ultimate Guide to Social Media," covering platform trends, digital risks, and strategies for safe use. Parents were encouraged to establish privacy settings, monitor readiness, and engage in open dialogue. The meeting also included a review of the district's Wellness Plan, which promotes student health through nutrition, physical activity, and wellness education, with members asked to review and offer feedback before the next meeting on April 14, 2025.
