  - Meningococcal

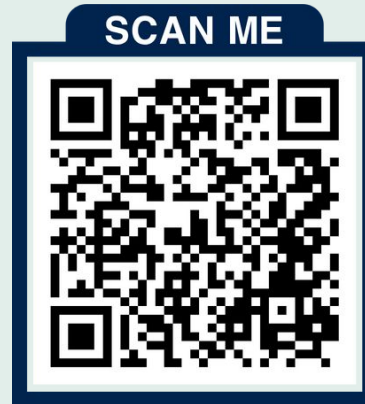


**EXCLUSION DAY IS OCTOBER 15th!**

# Lunch

# PE/Health

- Students will have PE 3 Quarters, Health 1 Quarter
- They will be required to buy a PE Uniform, Heart Rate Monitor Strap, and a Padlock for their PE Locker
  - 1<sup>st</sup> quarter PE uniforms will be sold the first week of school in PE classes, 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter PE uniforms will be sold during 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter PE class
  - **Padlock for PE Locker - \$5.00**
  - **PE uniform - \$18.00** (\$7.00 - shirt, \$11.00 - shorts)
  - **Heart Rate Monitor Strap - \$13.00 (sold 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter from your PE teacher)**
  - **Total = \$36.00**
- Padlocks for hallway lockers, (optional) - \$5.00  
(Sold in the office)



# Lockers & Backpacks

- **Backpacks need to stay in lockers during the day**
- **Lockers are personal and should not be shared**
- **Locks are required and must be a school issued lock.**
- **Students have 4 minutes between passing periods to stop at lockers.**

# Cell Phone Policy

- **Current Policy - Off and out of site**
- **SB2427 - Currently on its 2nd Reading in the House - already passed in the Senate**
- **If passed, students will keep cellphones in lockers, locked for the day.**
- **If they violate the policy they will get a 1st time warning, any subsequent violations will end with a parent pickup of the phone.**

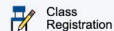

# The Parts of a Grade



## Summative Assessment

70%

- At the end of learning and is an evaluation designed to provide information to be used in making judgment about a student's mastery/achievement at the end of a sequence of instruction.
- Such assessment includes a unit or chapter test, major rubric based projects, final papers, semester examinations, final drafts of writing, major standards aligned projects, performances, formal presentations, final standards aligned products, skills assessments, journals, labs, and portfolios.

## Formative Practice

30%

- Teacher observation of students while learning, homework, quizzes, rough drafts, peer editing, interactive notebook reviews, classroom activities.
- Practice may also include formative assessments, such as, but not limited to, science labs, weekly grammar activities, reading comprehension checks, problem solving, vocabulary checks, and exit slips. We look at the practice category as the opportunity to rehearse the skills necessary to be successful on the summative assessment.

# Standards Based Information



## Syllabus for Each Class

























- Students will receive a syllabus for each class they are enrolled in that will detail the priority standards covered during each grading period.
- Syllabi can be found on Oak Prairie's website.
- Teachers will adhere to the syllabus to the best of the ability, but can take the liberty to address additional concepts or go at an alternate pace as needed for each class.

## Standards

- A standard will be attached to every assignment that is in the gradebook. It will be listed at the start of the the name of the assignment.
- The gradebook will take an average of the standards in both the Formative and Summative categories throughout the grading period.

# Retake Policy/Corrections

Students may have the opportunity to make corrections or retake a summative assessment in order to demonstrate improved mastery based on the content area. The highest grade that can be earned on a retake is an 85%. We encourage students to do their best, first time around. We also recognize that the rate of learning at times looks different for different students.

Classroom teachers will allow students to retake summative assessments providing the student follows a set procedure to secure the opportunity to retake. Classroom teachers will develop a procedure that works in their classroom. An example would be:

- Student fails test
- [Student completes a request](#) to re-take summative assessment to be signed by a parent / guardian
- Student completes additional learning opportunity and any missing work, prior to re-test
- Student turns in signed retake request
- Teacher arranges time with student to retake assessment
- Student retakes the assessment
- Student earns new grade based on most recent test taken

# Late and Absent Work

## **Late Work Policy**

The zero will be used only as a last resort when a student chooses not to complete assigned work. When calculating a zero into a student's grade, it has a very dramatic effect.

Late work will be accepted for partial credit up until the review day of a unit or chapter, or a test retake. Once the review and assessment is complete, no late work will be accepted and the student will receive a zero.

## **Absent Work Policy**

In the event a student is absent from school or misses class for any reason, they are still responsible for the work missed due to absences. The general rule is that they have 1 extra day to make up the work from an absence, and they need to communicate with their teacher. Extended absences will be handled on a case-by-case basis.



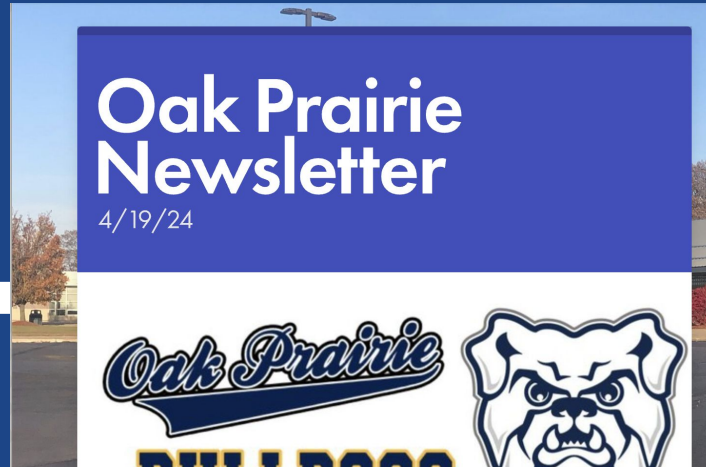
