He uses words like “gruff,” “fractiousness,” and “contempt” to describe Tom in an attempt to let the audience know that he is an unsavory character. Including the detail that people “hated his guts” immediately lets the audience in on the fact that Tom isn’t necessarily someone we will like or trust. The fact that our narrator, Nick, is relaying this information so freely also shows us that his allegiance does not lie with Tom.</p>
