Notes from the District Administrator



School has been in session for a month, the weather has been unpredictable but it is starting to feel like fall, Homecoming week has come and gone and we are moving into October and November. There are even more exciting things coming with our annual Halloween Trick or Treat and Thanksgiving break.

One of the most important times in November is when we celebrate Veterans Day. On the 11th day of the 11th month, we honor our military veterans who served their country and made it possible for us to be free. Originally this day was known as Armistice Day in recognition of the ending of World War 1 fighting at 11:00 a.m. on November 11, 1918. In 1954 Congress passed the bill that President Eisenhower signed proclaiming November 11th as Veterans Day.

Many of our staff members, students and community have served in the military or have relatives or friends who have served or are currently serving in the military. We owe so much to these people and their families who have sacrificed many things so that we can have the freedoms that we enjoy today. Just the simple act of going to school each day and being able to learn from many different perspectives is something that would not be possible without our veterans.

My 87-year-old father is one of those veterans. He was the youngest of 10 kids and grew up in small-town Nebraska as a dairy farmer. All five of his brothers went into the military right after high school and after a semester of college he decided to follow the tradition and enlisted in the army in 1955. He went to Colorado for basic training, was sent to Fort Devens Massachusetts for additional training and was sent to Japan for assignment.

In the beginning of his time in Japan, the FBI went to my dad's hometown of Stuart, NE. They talked to his family, his teachers, and members of the community to see what kind of man Jack Hytrek really was. He was being trained to do a job that had a high security clearance, so they needed to make sure he was a good man. I guess they had a lot of good things to say about him, because he spent the next two years in Okinawa working as a radio operator in the Army Security Agency translating Morse Code messages that foreign countries were passing. He was truly protecting our country and keeping it safe.

He couldn't talk very much about his time in the Army, but he was proud to have been able to serve his country. The fact that he was a veteran helped him to be able to become a teacher, coach, and a college professor who was able to impact future educators. He was even my professor as I worked to become a teacher.

The National Honor Society honors our veterans each year with a Veterans Day program. The students recognize local veterans and the A-B band and music department performs. One of my favorite parts of the program is when the Golden Needle Quilters present Quilts of Valor to local veterans. Learning more about and meeting these veterans is definitely a highlight of my year.

I want to thank everyone in our community who has served in the military, and I encourage all of you to attend our Veterans Day program this year. It is our opportunity to honor those who made it possible for us to be able to teach, to learn, and to experience life as we know it in this wonderful community. And who knows...maybe I'll be able to bring my dad to this year's program. See you on November 11th at 9:00 A.M. in the west gym.


