## Sartorette Wins Hoffmann Award

Sartorette Elementary School's Hispanic Student Achievement and Family Engagement Program has earned the Santa Clara County School Board Association's prestigious Glenn W. Hoffmann Award. Our school is among six recipients from the 31 school districts throughout Santa Clara County for the 2024-2025 school year. Sartorette's Hispanic Student Achievement & Family Engagement Program is a holistic approach tackling the challenges of both, understanding their relationship is reciprocal. Using the principles of culture

responsiveness, data-driven decisions, collaboration, and family engagement, staff worked with Hispanic parent leaders to combine best instructional practices with strategic family outreach. Student voice, compassion, and cultural empathy were integrated into optimal teaching methods for academic achievement.

"In one year, astounding results showed Hispanic students at or above grade level in English Language Arts state testing increased by over 19%," said **Sartorette Principal Debbie Stein**. "During that same time, the Hispanic achievement gap reduced 17%, and volunteer hours from a core group of Hispanic parents increased 662%. We couldn't be happier."

## Bagby's Fun Run Brought Fitness & Smiles

In late March, Bagby Elementary School's track came alive with laced-up sneakers, bright sunshine, and even brighter smiles during the school's 9th annual Fun Run. Students, staff, and families gathered for a day of running, jogging, and walking – all to support the school they love.
