Jennifer Meese Green, PhD

MULTILINGUAL EDUCATOR, TEACHER TRAINER, AUTHOR
FSHS CLASS OF 1989

Jennifer Meese Green, Academic Director of the Multilingual Education Program at Western Washington University, Bellingham, Washington, has extensive experience teaching English as a Second Language in the United States and abroad. She prepares pre- and in-service teachers to add their English Language Learner and Bilingual Education Endorsements.

Green repeated her senior year of high school as a Faribault Rotary Exchange student to Sweden. Her love of Sweden and its language inspired her to major in Scandinavian Studies and Social Studies Education at Gustavus Adolphus College where she was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa. After graduating from Gustavus, she moved to Japan where she taught English for two years. She returned to the United States and enrolled in the School for International Training at Brattleboro, Vermont, pursuing a Master's degree in Teaching English as a Second Language. Green joined the Peace Corps as part of her graduate program and was assigned to Ukraine where she served for twenty-seven months as a regional teacher trainer for Ukrainian teachers of English.

She returned to the United States to teach ESL in the St. Francis School District. Eventually, she and her husband moved east where she enrolled in a doctoral program at the University of Connecticut completing her PhD in Curriculum and Instruction. Because of her research interests in teacher education and systemic functional linguistics, WWU's Woodring College of Education offered her a full professorship. In 2023, Green became a Fulbright Scholar to the West Bank and Jordan. She returned to Jordan in November, 2024 to support work in English education in partnership with Fulbright, the U.S. State Department, the Jordanian Ministry of Education, and Al-Balqa Applied University.

Professor Green's experiences in Ukraine, Jordan, and the West Bank contribute to her reputation as an expert in delivering bilingual teacher training programs around the world.

Gary Kindseth

BUSINESSMAN, PUBLIC SERVANT FSHS CLASS OF 1965



Meticulous, loyal, creative, detailed, insightful, observant, perceptive, credible, and diligent; these are the words that one of Gary Kindseth's nominators used to describe him. After seeing all that he accomplished both professionally and as a community leader, these descriptors fit perfectly.

Gary attended Faribault Public Schools and was given his first job while in Mrs. Balken's class. She had him collect the lunch money. He did so well that he kept the job for three years. In high school, he was involved in sports and select choir, and considered himself an average student. After graduation, Gary worked a number of jobs to pay for college: a laborer at the Turkey plant, dishwasher at Wimpy's, and a bookkeeper at Foss Electric. He attended college and graduated from Mankato State with a degree in Business Administration.

Gary began a lengthy career with Faribault Foods in 1972 as traffic and warehouse manager, steadily moving up the ladder as production manager, operations coordinator, vice president of production, and finally becoming vice president of strategic planning.

Gary's pride and interest in Faribault led him to run for the City Council in 1973. He served as the youngest council member in Faribault history from 1973 to 1979, 1985 to 1995, 2008, and 2012. From 1980 to 1982, he served as mayor. He used his council work to promote many projects such as the remodel of City Hall and Library, and establishing River Bend Nature Center and the Senior Center. He also served on a number of boards including director for Midwest Food Processors, Chairman of Reliance Bank, The Economic Development Authority, the Ice Arena Task Force, the purchase of the YMCA, and on the Public Facilities Task Force. He served as Executive Director of the Industrial Corporation for 20 years. In 2007, Gary was honored to be named the Daily News Citizen of the Year.

Gary's accomplishments and his commitment to the community of Faribault are testaments to his belief in Faribault and his willingness to put in the hard work necessary to accomplish challenging goals. When asked if there was anything he would like to share with others he said, "Give to your community and your community will give back." It's apparent that Gary took his own advice.

Rodney Mahler

BUSINESSMAN AND PUBLIC SERVANT FSHS Class of 1949

Rodney "Rod" Mahler is deserving of the Alumni Award not only due to his career as a successful businessman, but more due to his life-long service to the Faribault community.

Mr. Mahler was an active student and athlete. He participated in band, choir and orchestra. Rod served as the sports editor for the school newspaper. His column was called "Locker Room Lingo By Rod".

Following graduation from Faribault Senior High, Rod attended Hamline University. He was involved in a full range of activities while attending Hamline: student government, music, and athletics. He served as the student Senior Class Vice President. Continuing his interest in music, he was a drummer in the Hamline band. He played tennis and earned 4 letters, serving as a player/coach for three of those years.

After his college career, Rod enlisted in the United States Army and served three years active duty. After completing his military service, Rod served another two years in active reserve and another two years in inactive duty.

Returning to Faribault, Rod joined his family in managing their hardware and appliance store for 27 years. Our Own Hardware was a pillar of the Faribault community for decades. Rod did memorable demonstrations for the new Weber grill. In fact, one year Rod cooked a whole hog in front of the store.

Rod was an active member of the community. He was on numerous boards and committees including The Faribault Chamber of Commerce, Downtown Council, United Way, Faribault Rotary (67 years), Paradise Center For the Arts, and the YMCA building committee.

One of Rod's special interests was big game hunting. Reflecting this passion, customers were thrilled to see trophies of Rod's hunting expeditions. A full-size mounted Kodiak Brown Bear was an especially unforgettable attraction.

Mr. Mahler eventually decided to leave the retail hardware trade. He went into sales and investments. Then for 20 years, he and his wife Jean, listed and sold homes in the Faribault area. Their slogan was "Two For the Price of One."

Drew Sande

Navy SEAL FSHS CLASS OF 1980



Drew Sande, Navy SEAL... enough said?

No, there's a lot to being a Navy SEAL and to Drew!

Drew graduated from FSHS in 1980. He realized college was not a good investment for him, so decided to join the Navy. At seventeen, his parents signed the enlistment papers, and he left for Boot Camp in October of 1980. After Boot Camp, he attended Engineman "A" School and Gas Turbine "C" School at Great Lakes, IL. He was then assigned to the USS Fox CG-33 (Guided Missile Cruiser) at Naval Station San Diego, CA.

A few years later, six months remaining on his first tour, he was planning to return home. But he connected with another SEAL that encouraged him to train and try out for Basic Underwater Demolitions/SEAL (BUD/S). Drew trained and passed the initial screening and graduated with BUD/S Class 133. 1985 was the beginning of his U.S. Navy SEAL career lasting another 22 years. He was assigned to SEAL Team FOUR in Little Creek, VA, which specialized in jungle warfare and maritime operations.

Drew completed three deployments to the Caribbean and the Mediterranean. He participated in sensitive operations including Operation Just Cause in Panama in 1989. The joint operation was successful but, unfortunately, SEAL Team FOUR lost four brave Teammates during the assault on Patilla Airfield. Drew was nominated as SEAL Team FOUR's Sailor of the year in 1989.

Drew also served at Naval Special Warfare Development Group, in Va. Beach, SEAL Team ONE and Naval Special Warfare Command-Admiral's Staff in Coronado, CA, then SEAL Team TEN and Naval Special Warfare Center-Advanced Training Command in Va. Beach. Drew completed Deployments during Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan and Operation Iraqi Freedom in Iraq.

Drew's other honors include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2), Joint Service Commendation Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (4), Navy Achievement Medal (5) and multiple Campaign Awards. He recently served as the President of the UDT-SEAL Association and on the Board of the SEAL Veterans Foundation in support of Naval Special Warfare Veterans and Active Duty.



Jason Lee Tako

ARTIST OF THE AMERICAN WEST FSHS CLASS OF 1990

After graduating from FSHS in 1990, Jason attended what later became McNally Smith College of Music, graduating with honors. After some time in the field of music, he went to school for applied visual arts at Dakota County Technical College and was encouraged to pursue a career in fine art. Finding a home in historical Native American subjects, his love of landscapes of the American West combined with his interest of history has resulted in his expression depicting cultures and ways of life that are forever etched into the American West.

Jason paints historical Native American subjects in Western landscapes. He primarily works in oil and through direct observation from nature, such as plein air painting (with a strong sense of open air). His work explores themes of restoration, solitude, and reconnecting with nature.

Jason's work has been exhibited all across the United States, including the C.M. Russell Museum and Legacy Gallery. He has been the Featured Artist at prestigious events such as the Southeastern Wildlife Expo and NatureWorks. Jason is one of the foremost Western, wildlife, and historical Native American painters.

Jason expressed, "For me, painting is a way to capture the fleeting feeling of a place and time. I tend to be a bit nostalgic and I love nature. When I'm in the mountains or on the prairie, I get overwhelmed with the beauty and deep emotions of peace, purity, and mystery I sense there. Through my work I first internalize it, and then visually express it to give the viewer the same feeling of being there.

"I have always been fascinated with the American Indians and how they lived, immersed in this beauty when it was still unspoiled. They had the unique privilege of experiencing this on a daily basis before it was taken from them; a tremendous loss as they were removed from their refuge of nature and put somewhere they didn't want to go."

His nominator stated, "Although a highly successful artist, he gives his time and talents freely. He is often sharing his knowledge online, encouraging and coaching other artists. He's also making a significant contribution to Native American heritage in documenting their history and culture."

Nancy (Meyer) Van Buren, MD

PATHOLOGIST AND BLOOD TRANSFUSION SPECIALIST FSHS CLASS OF 1975



Nancy Van Buren, MD is a medical doctor specializing in pathology and transfusion medicine. She explains that pathologists are physicians with specialized training to diagnose medical conditions using tests performed on blood or fluid samples. Blood banking and transfusion experts oversee testing and collection of blood for patients in need of transfusion therapy.

Dr. Van Buren's passion for the medical field came naturally. She was inspired growing up in a family consisting of generations of doctors and a father who encouraged her to become a physician in an era when few women were doctors. Her high school nurses' aide job caring for elderly patients at St. Lucas Nursing Home helped her make a decision to follow family footsteps into the field of medicine. She remained close to home for her medical training, earning a degree in Biology from St. Olaf College in 1979 and graduating from the University of Minnesota Medical School in 1983.

During her career, she worked for 27 years as a hospital-based pathologist and transfusion medical director for hospitals in Northeast Tennessee and St. Paul, MN, serving in various hospital leadership positions and volunteering as medical director on local and national blood banking organizations. She co-founded a bone marrow donor registry in Tennessee and later served Minnesota Blood Centers and Transfusion Services as Director at Hennepin Healthcare HCMC and Children's Hospitals of Minnesota.

Dr. Van Buren earned recognition and multiple awards including America's Top Physicians (2006 and 2007), and Top Doctor (2024). Since her retirement in 2023, she continues to consult and speak on the topic of transfusion medicine, contribute to medical journals and textbooks, visit elderly people in assisted living facilities with her trained therapy dog, and participate in a reading program for children.
