AAST Students Taking Part in CCU Research







Clean Energy and Aerospace Engineering students participated in a CCU Burroughs and Chapin Center for Marine and Wetland Studies Smart Reef Cruise near the Ron McManus and Jim Caudle Reefs off the coast of North Myrtle Beach. The CCU students' goal for this semester is to do a complete sonar habitat map to compare to the previous geophysical survey conducted 20 years ago. This essential/critical fish habitat moves over time, and the new data will help calculate a rate of change. In addition, a remotely operated vehicle (ROV) will be used to gather photomosaics to create a 3D simulation of the reef to track successful growth of encrusting communities. What an amazing learning opportunity for our students to be a part of!

Purple Up Day at AAST
