What other projects are currently underway?

In June 2017, the Board of Trustees approved the issuance of \$2,300,000 in Maintenance Tax Notes to address critical capital improvement projects in the District.

This funding and projects are distinct and separate from this Bond request.

The current projects include no new square footage, and address critical repairs in existing buildings, including:

- High School Roof Replacement
- High School Foundation Repairs
- Drainage Improvements at the Elementary School and High School
- Building Exterior Sealant and Weather Stripping Replacement
- Power Quality Repairs
- Refurbish the Jr. High Gymnasium to include installation of air conditioning

What is on the ballot?

The issuance of \$10,000,000 of bonds by Poth Independent School District for the purpose of financing the acquisition, construction and equipment of school buildings, and levying the tax in payment thereof.

Why did the District call the Bond Election?

The Board of Trustees appointed <u>20</u> community members to the Facilities Planning Committee to study and recommend upgrades, renovations and new facilities needed at Poth ISD. The Committee met multiple times to review and recommend priority projects.

The Board called the 2017 Bond Program following review of the recommendations of the Facilities Planning Committee, which included:


- New Career and Technology Facility
- Renovated and Increased Space for Band and Music Programs
- Renovations and Upgrades to Jack Lane Field

I'm over 65. Are my taxes frozen?

YES

School taxes on the homestead plus 20 acres for people over the age of 65 are frozen. The taxes cannot be raised even if the residence is reappraised, unless the owner makes significant improvements to the property, at which time the taxes are frozen again. If you qualify for the Senior Citizen exemption, there is NO TAX INCREASE on your homestead plus 20 acres.

How does the proposed tax rate compare to previous years?



(*)With the issuance of the Bonds, the District's total Tax Rate is projected to be \$1.39 in the 2018-2019 school year. This rate with the Bonds is lower than the \$1.49 rate the District set during the 2005-2006 school year.

What will it cost me for the bond projects?

The tax rate impact of the Bonds is estimated at 21.77¢. Below is the calculated impact of a \$100,000 home*.

(*) Net taxable value is \$75,000 due to \$25,000 Homestead Exemption.

Where does the District receive its tax revenues from?

Only 19.23% of the District's tax revenues come from residences.
