### **WORK SESSION MINUTES**

A Work Session of the Springfield School District No. 19 Board of Education was held on April 14, 2025.

**School Board**

### A. Linda Merritt

Merritt, although lacking school committee experience, stressed her understanding of fiscal management's impact on an organization's success and highlighted her commitment to the District's future success.

## D. Patrick Walch

Walch highlighted his varied and extensive experience in finance and passion for education. He discussed his community involvement and emphasized the importance of holistic education and community engagement through personal stories.

Both candidates discussed their strategies for handling differing opinions on the committee and ensuring effective representation.
