
RESS Recycles!

Fourth grade students enjoyed their field trip to Laurel Caverns, where they learned about rock formations, limestone, erosion, and how caverns are formed.




Fun on the Farm

Every family is required to volunteer a certain amount of time or choose the volunteer buyout option. We encourage everyone to do the required volunteer hours but if you decide to choose the buyout option, it will be due at the time of registration (\$500 for 1 child/\$600 for family). For Football There will be a \$50/child equipment deposit due in July and you will purchase your Jersey and Pants to keep. The deposit will be returned when equipment is returned at the end of the season; in satisfactory condition. Cheer uniform information will be provided at registration.

DIVISION 1 – 5th & 6th grade (Ineligible if 13 before July1st) DIVISION 2 – 3rd & 4th grade (If 11 before July1st, must play Division 1) DIVISION 3 – K - 2nd grade

(If 9 before July 1st, must play Division 2)

*Cheer squads will generally be determined by the above guidelines but may be adjusted to ensure full squads.

All divisions are fully padded, play heads up tackle football, and are coached by USA Football Level I tackle, certified coaches. This certification includes training in heat, cardiac, and concussion awareness as well as proper heads up tackling technique. Weight limits are for skilled positions only so no child is turned away due to size. Our cheer coaches are also certified in heat, cardiac, and concussion awareness. Practices will start in July at Palmer Park and our home games are played at Ringgold High School. Rules and regulations for practices and games may change this year and we will keep all families informed as we learn information.
