English

9th grade - All students take English I

- Students must take an English course each year

Math

Graduation Requirement - must pass Algebra I

9th Grade Math Options:

Algebra 1

- Most 9th graders take this class

Geometry**

- ONLY for students who pass both semesters of Algebra in 8th grade with C's or better

30 total Math credits

History/Social Science

No History class during 9th grade year required

- 9th grade - Ethnic Studies
-optional class for elective credit
- 10th grade - World History
- 11th grade - US History
- 12th grade - Government/Economics - (semester long classes)

9th Grade options:

Biology: The Living Earth

OR

Principles of Bio-Med

- Principles of Bio-Med is part of the *Project Lead the Way* pathway for students who are very interested in the bio-medical field. Students in the pathway take the following sequence of courses:

9th - Principles of Bio-Med

11th - Human Body Systems

10th - Chemistry/Physics

12th - Medical Interventions

- Must have B or higher in 8th grade science class
- All students must fill out an application

20 total Science credits

(2 classes- 1 year of Life Science and 1 year of Physical Science)

PE

9th grade = PE 9

10th grade = **Personal Fitness***

or

take alternate PE class (must have C
or better)

or

defer (skip PE in 10th grade)

20 total PE credits
