

AUTHORIZATION FOR CAFETERIA CHARGES

Anchorage Independent Public School

The foodservice unit of the Anchorage Public School offers parents the opportunity to allow their children to charge items in the lunchroom. We require parental authorization to charge up to a maximum of one hundred dollars (\$100) per child with the understanding that charges will be repaid in full prior to the end of the school year and that **finance charges will accrue on outstanding balances**. Also as a service, parents can place pre-payments on their child's account off which their children can charge items that they purchase.

Each year parents must authorize charges during online registration, or by completing the following and returning it to Mrs. Mackenzie Bartley, Director – Foodservices, Anchorage School. This must be completed and on file before the initial charge can be made.
