Transportation

Our students can be bus riders, walkers, car riders or go to Y-Care.

If you want your student to ride the bus

You need to request a bus stop at https://www.tumwater.k12.wa.us/departments/transportation This may take up to 5 working days to set up.

You will receive a phone call from your bus driver around the first week in September letting you know the route number and bus stop times.

Kindergarteners must be met at their bus stop by an adult in the afternoon or they will not be let off the bus.

When your child is absent from school

When you arrive please sign in at the visitor kiosk and let the office staff know where you are going in the building.

Kindergarten Readiness includes...

- · Excitement toward learning
- Talking about thoughts and feelings
- · Playing well with others and taking turns
- Following simple instructions
- Recognizing numbers and letters
- Desire to be independent
 (dressing themselves, bathroom use, feeding themselves)
- · Ability to hold and use a pencil or crayon
- Listening to and respecting others during social interactions



What can I do to help prepare my child for Kindergarten?

- Read, read, read!
- Letter formation practice
- Cutting with scissors
- Coloring
- Practice writing their first name
- Memorizing their name and phone number
- Talk about what it means to be a friend and part of a community.
- Work on independence with putting on and fastening their clothing, jackets, and shoes (zippers, buttons, snaps, Velcro)
- Work on independently opening any food items they will bring for lunch/ snack, etc.
- Have them practice bathroom skills independently.
- Work on fine-motor skills such as using scissors and holding pencils.
