Campbell Schools have a partnership with Akron Children's Pediatrics (ACP) enabling your student to receive medical care while at school. The ACP office is located on the campus of the elementary building. Students who report to the school clinic sick can be seen that day with parent/guardian permission. Transportation can be arranged from school to ACP. Telehealth services are also available to all students every day that school is in session where your student can be seen remotely for illness.

We are excited that you are interested in becoming part of the Northeast Ohio IMPACT Academy Family. Please read through the following information before starting your application. Requirements for Admissions:

- Student is a current resident of Ohio (or will be relocating to Ohio)
- Student is not under suspension/expulsion from current school
- Student will be promoted to the next grade level at the end of the 2024-2025 school year
- Student will be in grades 8-12 for the 2025-2026 school year



Application Process

- Complete the entire application, electronically sign, and submit
- Check your email provided on the application for confirmation of receiving your email
- Confirmation does not guarantee acceptance
- All communication will be completed through email. Please make sure that your email is valid and that it is checked regularly

Next Steps in the Application Process

Each year we admit a full class of students in the 8th grade, and then fill any open seats in grades 9-11. If we receive more applications than available seats in a grade then a lottery will be held.

You will be notified via email to let you know if your student was accepted or placed on the waiting list. If you accept the spot, you will complete the acceptance form by the reply date. If we do not hear from you by the reply date your student's seat will be given to another student. The students on the waiting list will be notified of newly available seats on an on-going basis.
