Subject:	Temporary Athletic Fields for West and Highland High Schools

Summary:

Following the Board's recent feedback, we've taken meaningful steps to refine our approach to temporary athletic field accommodations for West and Highland High Schools. We recognize the importance of balancing fiscal responsibility with the need to support our student-athletes, and we've adjusted accordingly.

We now propose moving forward with temporary fields at Dilworth, Clayton, and Glendale, all of which remain feasible locations. All costs are estimates and we will continue to look for efficiencies in these field enhancements including the possible elimination of the scoreboard installation if they are deemed nonessential.

Additionally, we've had further productive discussions with the Salt Lake City regarding the Mary Jackson and Backman sites. These conversations have introduced new possibilities for West High teams to utilize existing city parks and facilities on the west side. These options could provide high-quality field access for our athletes at a much lower cost to the district. We are pausing any further planning or funding for Mary Jackson and Backman while we continue to explore these promising city partnerships.

Requested Board action:

We request board approval to proceed with the following projects to facilitate high school sport programs during the high school rebuild projects:

Upgrade the existing Glendale track and add a field for soccer and lacrosse. This is estimated at a cost of \$4 to \$5 million. The Salt Lake Education Foundation will run a donation campaign to help offset a portion of the total cost.

Add a softball field to the green space behind Clayton Middle School. This has an estimated cost of \$1.5 million.

Upgrade the existing ball diamond behind Dilworth Elementary to accommodate high school baseball. This has an estimated cost of \$2.5 million


