K-Bar Learning Center

The 8th-grade Introduction to Agriculture course for middle school students provides an opportunity for them to collaborate with the agriculture program at Eagle Point High School. EPHS Ag is currently in its third year of offering 8th-grade agriculture classes, with students from White Mountain Middle School bused to the high school in the morning and Eagle Point Middle School students attending in the afternoon. This program has experienced continuous growth each year since its inception, evolving from a curriculum focused solely on agricultural education in the first year to offering hands-on learning opportunities and participation in FFA activities over the past two years.

The 8th Grade Introduction to Agriculture course covers a wide range of agriculture-related fields, including Ag Careers, Animal Science, Plant and Soil Science, Ag Mechanics, Ecology and Natural Resources, Food Products and Processing, Meat Science, Ag Communications, Entomology, and Ag Business.

Students have enjoyed hands-on learning experiences in both the ag shop and the greenhouses. During a three-week session in the shop, they work alongside advanced ag mechanics students to learn welding techniques.

Shaping the Next Generation of Agricultural Leaders

These advanced students serve as mentors, providing one-on-one guidance in both Stick and MIG welding. For another three weeks in the greenhouses, 8th graders learn to plant seeds and transplant various flower and vegetable starts for our annual plant sale from May 8th - 10th.

This year, for the first time, 8th-grade students have also been able to compete on various Career Development Event (CDE) teams. Last spring, we had our inaugural 8th-grade team compete in the Veterinary Science CDE, where they won first place for the Beginning Team at the district level! Participation has continued to increase this year, with 8th-grade members taking part in Vet Science, Livestock Judging, Meat Science, and Dairy Products teams. Additionally, this will be the first year that 8th-grade members can attend the State FFA Convention to participate in workshops, sessions, and the career

As the 8th-grade Introduction to Agriculture course continues to grow and evolve, it provides students with experiences and skills that extend beyond the classroom. By collaborating with the EPHS Agriculture program, engaging in hands-on learning, and participating in FFA events, students are gaining a deeper understanding of the many components of agriculture. These opportunities not only create a sense of teamwork and responsibility but also help prepare students for future opportunities in agriculture and related fields. With continued growth and success, this program is shaping the next generation of agricultural leaders.

Ila Richardson Named Oregon State Star Farmer for 2025!

Eagle Point High School senior Ila was shocked to find out she had been named the Oregon State Star Farmer for 2025. This recognition comes after years of hard work, dedication, and a passion for agriculture that began long before high school.

Ila, a standout student in the Agricultural Sciences program, earned the award for her beef entrepreneurship project. "I've been developing this operation over the past four years in FFA, but it really started ten years ago," she said. "Condensing everything into one application was definitely a big challenge."

She first learned about the Star Farmer award while she was working on her beef entrepreneurship proficiency—a category that highlights student-led agricultural businesses. Her teacher, Ms. Hertensen, encouraged her to also apply for the Star Farmer award, noting how closely the two were aligned.

"At first, I applied kind of just for fun," Ila admitted. "I didn't think I'd be competitive at all."

After submitting a very extensive application—one that took over 40 hours to complete—she was named one of the top three finalists in the state. The three students then moved on to another interview round with a panel of judges asking more detailed questions about their work.

"I was really nervous going into the interview," Ila shared. "It was about 30 minutes long, and they asked me to expand on my written answers, justifying and explaining how I managed my project. It was a deep dive into everything I've done."

As Ila sat at the awards ceremony, there was a moment of confusion when the wrong slide was shown on the screen, accidentally revealing Ila's name before the winner was announced. She tried not to get her hopes up, but couldn't help but wonder if it was real or an accident.

"I just kept thinking, 'Don't get excited. It might be a mistake,'" she said. "Even when they called my name, I couldn't believe it. It was surreal."

It took some time for the accomplishment to sink in and although the Star Farmer Award doesn't come with a scholarship, the recognition is invaluable. "It's definitely something I'll carry with me," Ila said. "It shows the work I've done and helps me stand out on any future applications."

After graduation, Ila plans to attend Fort Scott Community College in Kansas, where she'll compete on their livestock judging team and study animal science. Her long-term goal is to transfer to Kansas State University and earn a doctorate in veterinary medicine, with the dream of running her own cattle operation in the future.

Despite the demanding work and rigorous process, Ila says it has all been worthwhile. "Having a plan and working toward something I care about—it makes everything feel more meaningful."

From Eagle Point High School to the state stage, Ila has exemplified what it means to be a leader in agriculture. Congratulations to Oregon's 2025 Star Farmer—we are proud!





Eagle Point Middle School, home of "The Panthers", opened its doors in March of 2003 on the northern edge of beautiful Eagle Point, Oregon. Our campus is nestled among neighborhoods and farmland with a clear view of Mt. McLaughlin. Nearly 450 students and 34 staff members make up the Eagle Point Middle School family. In addition to rigorous coursework, students have many afterschool opportunities to compete in sports and activities. EPMS offers football, volleyball, cross country, basketball, wrestling, track and field, spelling contests, brain bowl, band, choir, art, STEAM and academic scavenger hunt. White Mountain Middle School, home of "The Wolves", serves the community of White City in beautiful Southern Oregon. Our school serves 344 students in grades 6-8 with an average class size of about 25 students. Table Rock Elementary, home of "The Tigers", was established in 2013 to meet the needs of all elementary students in White City. We are the only school in EPSD9 with a pre-school. We serve 762 students in a neighborhood educational atmosphere where we proudly honor the culture and diversity of our community. Table Rock Elementary has a dynamic staff comprised of 42 teachers and 44 staff members who are all caring, professional, educators. Not only do we offer all the essentials for general education, but we are proud to offer Dual Language Education in Spanish / English. Our students have the opportunity to participate in our dual language program beginning in pre-school and continuing through all grade levels. Come join us at Table Rock Elementary!

Eagle Rock Elementary School, home of "The Owls", is a beautiful school overlooking the city of Eagle Point. Eagle Rock opened in 2003 and was designed as a walking school for the fast growing surrounding neighborhoods. Built into the side of a hill with a gym that resembles a barn, Eagle Rock has 14 certified teachers and approximately 340 K–5th grade students, most living within a mile of the school. We are very proud of our knowledge and use of technology in our classrooms and are on the cutting edge in this area to help improve student achievement. Hillside Elementary School, home of "The Huskies", opened in April of 2012. Hillside is a beautiful, modern school situated in the center of a friendly, rural community. There are 425 K-5th grade students enrolled. There are 26 certified teachers with an average of 22 students per class. Hillside Elementary school also hosts lots of family centered events. Hillside students love coming to school and we have an excellent staff that is focused on students' well-being, academic growth and preparing them for a successful future. All of us at Hillside are proud of our school and hope you come for a visit!

Shady Cove School, home of "The Mighty Wolverines!" We are a unique K-8th grade small community school nestled in the hills of the Upper Rogue River. We have approximately 270 students and a caring staff made up of 15 Certified Teachers, 1 Instructional Coach, 9 Instructional Assistants, 2 Secretaries, 2 Maintenance Personnel and a Principal. Our Middle School has a great student turnout for a variety of both girls and boys sports that are offered as well as many school sponsored activities. Being a small school allows us the special opportunity to build meaningful relationships and make connections with students, parents, and the community which is crucial to the success of students. Shady Cove was named one of Oregon's "Model Schools" in 2012 which is a great achievement and a tribute to our caring, family atmosphere!

Lake Creek Learning Center, home of "The Elk", is situated on a portion of a 1,000 acre ranch on the outskirts of Eagle Point in the small wooded community of Lake Creek. The K – 5th grade school opened its doors in January of 2000. There are about 52 students enrolled in 3 multi-grade classrooms. Each day we have "community circle" and enjoy dining together as a group at lunchtime. The small learning environment at LCLC promotes strong academic performance, with many of our students making honor roll at the middle and high school levels. Parents and volunteer groups are actively involved at Lake Creek Learning Center and take advantage of the beautiful outdoor setting for a variety of activities.

SHADY COVE MIDDLE SCHOOL

URCEO, Upper Rogue Center for Educational Opportunities, home of "The Osprey", provides individual tutoring, mentoring and teaching strategies to students that need an alternative to the normal school day.
