#### NOTE FROM: Nathan Barber, Head of Upper School

As we approach our exam week next week, many of our kids have a lot on their plates for the next ten days or so. Here's how you can help. Ask your child about his or her exam schedule. Get the exams marked on the calendar, then start a conversation about how and when studying for each exam will happen. As we all know, cramming the night before is the least effective way to study. You can encourage your child, or even help them schedule time, to begin studying a few days ahead of time with study time planned each day leading up to the exam. Sleep is huge, so helping your child get to bed at a reasonable hour the night before each exam is extremely important. Similarly, getting up at a time the morning of the exam that allows your

child to not be rushed would be ideal. Another great piece of advice is to make sure your child has breakfast before each morning of testing.

### NOTE FROM: Jocelyn Muckelroy, Assistant Head of Upper School

Just a reminder that if you want to bring your child food, you must come in the building and leave it at the front. I understand that it seems to be inconvenient, but we have students going to the parking lot retrieving food and it is hard to discern between a parent and Door Dash, which is not allowed. Thank you for helping us keep students safe.

Please make sure your student is in dress code every day. They need to be in uniform pants, shorts, or skirt (not rolled), uniform shirt or college hoodie (seniors only). In terms of footwear, Crocs, Birkenstocks and Ugg house shoes are not allowed.

Please make sure you are familiar with the Final Exam Exemption Policy listed below.

#### Final Exam Exemption Policy

Exemptions from final exams: For the Spring semester, **freshmen may request one exemption; sophomores may request two exemptions; juniors may request three exemptions; and seniors can be exempt from all exams**. Students may choose which exams to exempt.

In order to be exempt a student must meet the following qualifications:

- A 90 or above average in the class for the semester
  - \*Grades will be calculated based on the average of the Q3 grade and the Q4 grade as of the second Friday in May. If a student's grade changes after that date, their exemption status will remain unaltered.
- No Unexcused Absences in the class for the semester
- No more than five Excused Absences in the class for the semester
  - \*Absences due to school-sponsored activities, approved college visits, or death in the immediate family are not counted against the student.
- No more than four tardies in the class for the semester
- No disciplinary issues for the semester

Additionally, any student taking an AP exam will be automatically exempt from the semester exam, regardless of their semester grade for that course, provided

they meet the absence, tardy and disciplinary requirements.

Exemptions apply to exams only; final projects do not qualify.

Please note that exemptions are a privilege and not a right. As such, we will not accept retroactive excuses at the end of the semester in an attempt to bring absences and/or tardies in line with the exemption requirements. Excuse notes must be submitted within 48 hrs of the absence in order to be considered valid. These notes may be sent to usattendance@fortbendchristian.org. Notes need to be from a physician or parent and include student name, date of absence and reason.

#### **Updated Student Default Password Instructions**

**Updated Student Default Passwords:** 9th grade students have a new default password. The default password for students will be Fb+Student ID # (for example, Samantha has a student ID # of 12502099 and therefore her default password is Fb12502099).

Instructions on how to obtain your child's student ID:

- 1. Sign in to MyFBCA as a parent with your email address
- 2. Under Children select the student's name
- 3. Click on the Contact Card tab
- 4. Under General Information notate the Student ID #

Student ID numbers are only visible to faculty, staff, the student, and the student's parent/guardian. A student ID # should never be shared with other students at any time. Please take a moment to review this with your child to keep their account and information secure.
