

Help Shape Your Baby's Healthy Brain

The brain is the part of the body that feels joy or despair, reacts in a loving or angry way, or uses reason instead of simply reacting. These abilities don't just appear. They are the result of heredity and the experiences the baby has during childhood.

Babies' brains are greatly influenced by:

- Their relationships with parents and other important caregivers.
- Their sense of sight, sound, smell, touch and taste.
- The feelings they experience, and
- The challenges they meet.

Use babies' "Quiet Alert" time to help them grow and learn. Keep your baby near you. Babies thrive on loving attention. Smile when you talk!

Parents who provide responsive, loving care automatically stimulate their baby's brain development.

First of all, ***always*** respond to your crying infant. Pick the baby up and try to figure out what's wrong. By trusting ***you***, your baby learns to trust the world.

Touch is just as important. Holding and stroking an infant stimulates growth. ***How*** you express your love positively affects your baby's brain.
