Travelog	Choose a state or canton from Switzerland, Austria, or one of Germany's new states and create a PowerPoint presentation	To use technology and language skills to familiarize the class these countries.
Autobiographical Letter of summer activities	Students write a five paragraph essay of activities that occurred to utilize past tenses.	To review yearlong units and develop writing skills
