Brief Course Description:

This course meets UC/CSU (E) and district graduation requirements. Students will learn about the language and culture of Spanish-speaking countries. Introductory-level skills in listening, reading writing and speaking will be developed through a variety of instructional activities. Emphasis will be placed on verbal communication in the target language on a regular basis in order to enhance student's linguistic abilities.

I. Goals

The student will:

- A. Understand various Spanish-speaking cultures and traditions
- B. Respond to writing prompts using the target language
- C. Prepare and present presentations on a variety of subjects
- D. Express original and creative thought through written and speaking form in the target language
- E. Utilize correct grammatical structures in the target language
- F. Comprehend target language through audio, visual, reading and listening materials.

Semester II

- F. Describe the weather.
