Prerequisite: Completion of Spanish Level One with a grade of C or better

Brief Course Description:

This course meets UC/CSU (E) and district graduation requirements. Students will learn about the language and culture of Spanish-speaking countries. Introductory-level skills in listening, reading writing and speaking will be developed through a variety of instructional activities. Emphasis will be placed on verbal communication in the target language on a regular basis in order to enhance student's linguistic abilities.

I. Goals

The student will:

- A. Read various forms of text in the target language
- B. Develop essays in the target language
- C. Prepare and present presentations on a variety of subjects
- D. Be exposed to current events related to social, political and economic developments in Spanish Speaking countries
- E. Express original and creative thought through written and verbal skills in the target language
- F. Utilize correct grammatical structures in the target language

Semester I

- B. Describe people and place; exchange information
- C. Describe school life and the school year
- D. Describe leisure time activities and vacation places
- E. Describe past activities and activity preferences

- H. Describe past family celebrations and family activities in progress
- I. Order food in a restaurant, ask for and pay a restaurant bill and describe food
- J. Discuss city life and activities, including the arts

Semester II

- A. Discuss ways to stay fit and healthy, daily routines and personal care
- B. Discuss job completion and chores
- C. Discuss travel plans and recreational activities
- D. Describe rooms, furniture and appliances
- E. Describe the city or town
- F. Make suggestions, give advice, ask for and give directions
- G. Discuss shopping for clothes, give opinions, make comparisons and money management
- H. Describe geographic characteristics, conservation, nature and the environment
