President Diffley reconvened the meeting to open session at 5:05 p.m. He announced that the meeting was being audio recorded, livestream broadcast and that votes would be conducted by roll call.

1. Report Action Taken in Closed Session

During the recently concluded closed session, the Board, on a motion by Linda Lunn seconded by Nancy Young, voted unanimously to approve a Settlement Agreement with Arch Insurance Company ("Arch"), which was the performance bond and payment bond surety for MVC Enterprises, Inc. ("MVC"). MVC was the District's contractor for the concrete and general sitework portion of the Murrieta Mesa High School New Classroom Building Project ("Project").

The Settlement Agreement resolves all disputes between the District and Arch that arose on the Project and performance bond. The Settlement Agreement is a compromise of disputed issues, and not an admission of any liability or wrongdoing by any party.

Under the Settlement Agreement, Arch will pay the District \$38,249.22 as full and final satisfaction of the District's bond claims. The District and Arch will mutually release all claims against each other involving the Project or performance bond. Arch will defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the District from any claim by MVC subcontractors or suppliers including stop payment notice enforcement actions.

3. Superintendent Report

Superintendent, Dr. Andrus remarked that the months of March and April are tremendous examples of what goes on in the District on a regular basis and that teachers are working diligently on leading their classrooms. Dr. Andrus reported attending many district activities, such as band, theater, and choir performances, along with witnessing the changing of command at Murrieta Mesa High School ROTC. He commented on the positive impact the abundant parent and community engagement has on the District. Dr. Andrus said the Murrieta Elementary School construction project is proceeding now that the rain has let up. He also announced that Board member Linda Lunn was recognized for her dedication and service by Murrieta Rotary with the Paul Harris Fellow Commendation. Dr. Andrus encouraged parents to explore their options for enrolling in the District Transitional Kindergarten program.

5. Employee Organization Reports

Board member Linda Lunn shared her excitement about receiving the "Bus Stop" newsletter from the transportation department. Mrs. Lunn commented on the upcoming Safest Summer event and the Job Fair at the city park. She reported attending Dorothy McElhinney Middle School unified track and field event, the Rotary Vocational Service awards luncheon and the Crystal Apple awards ceremony.

Board member Nicolas Pardue spoke about the divided community and the election process being the way for a community to express their opinions. He addressed his attendance at the Temecula Critical Race Theory meeting, stating that it was important for him to learn more about CRT in order to have a dialogue about it. Mr. Pardue reported attending the Crystal Apple Awards ceremony, Riverside County Academic Awards ceremony and meeting with the District's Business Services team to learn more about budgeting. He also expressed his concerns about the curriculum adoption process and the Profile of a Graduate content.

Board member Nancy Young commented on her attendance at an Equity and Human Rights conference in Santa Clara and the interfaith Ramadan dinner. She reported attending the Rotary Vocational Services Awards luncheon and the unified sports event that was held at her school and being able to take her students with her. Mr. Rideout is being employed as Assistant Superintendent, Human Resources for a four-year term, July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2027. His annual salary of \$232,078, is payable in 12 equal monthly installments. Any work performed prior to his July 1 start date shall be paid to him at his per diem rate. The Assistant Superintendent's salary may be augmented as follows:

- The Assistant Superintendent shall receive an annual increase of 2%, as set forth in the Agreement.
- The Assistant Superintendent's salary may be increased by approval of the Governing Board after consideration of such factors as performance evaluation, District finances, and bargaining unit settlements.
