1. Measure BB Citizens' Oversight Committee Update

Measure BB Citizens' Oversight Committee Chairperson, Wesley Burchartz, provided an overview of the committee's purpose, an update on the committee members, vacant seats, meeting dates and said that the committee was proud to report no financial abuses within the scope of the Measure BB funds.

Jose Contreras, Director of Facilities, provided a brief overview of the Murrieta Elementary School project and said the estimated completion of the new classroom building is May 2024.

2. Presentation of Multi-Tiered Systems of Support

Staff presenters, Howard Dimler, Executive Director, Student Services, Yoana Armendariz, Coordinator, and Kari Gonzalez, Coordinator shared the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) Purpose Statement: *We are committed to reaching hearts and teaching minds. Our school are determined to ensure students, staff, and families feel valued and connected. We collaboratively engage to create systems necessary to promote equitable opportunities and outcomes for all.*

The team outlined the elements of an effective Tier 1 system, (1) rally a team, (2) define behavioral expectations, (3) explicitly teach school-wide expectations, (4) acknowledge positive behavior, and (5) create a behavior response system. Monte Vista Elementary School was highlighted as the first Murrieta school to receive state recognition as a Silver Implementation Award winner. They provided an update to the 2023-24 MTSS Tier 1 implementation timeline and presented the Fall 2024-25 continued Tier 1 implementation and next steps to Tier 2 implementation.

3. Presentation of the 2023/24 LCAP Mid-Year Report

Faythe Mutchnick-Jayx, Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services presented an overview of the 2023/24 LCAP Mid-Year Report. This added requirement for an annual update to the Local Control and Accountability Plan and Budget Overview for Parents is further outlined in Senate Bill 114. The Board received a detailed report that included all available midyear outcome data related to metrics identified in the current LCAP and all available midyear expenditure and implementation data on all actions identified in the current LCAP.

H. SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Dr. Andrus spoke about student performance in the classroom, on the athletic fields, in clubs and other academic contests like spelling bees. He reported attending the E. Hale Curran Elementary School Growth Parade to highlight how the students had grown during this year. He expressed his gratitude to the district parents and staff. He reported on the Superintendent's Advisory Council meeting and their discussion related to the Profile of a Graduate.

I. BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Trustee Julie Vandegrift reported listening to the Lozano Smith podcast episode related to legislation about student behavioral issues. She mentioned the grim California Budget outlook. In honor of Black History Month, Mrs. Vandegrift commended the Black Mothers Forum for creating micro schools, or 'School of Purpose Academies', which foster blended learning for small groups of students and reinforces the belief that

parents are the experts on what is best for their children. She commented on the senior culminating project and junior reflective essay and questioned if choosing an unpaid career goal could negatively impact a student's grade, highlighting the importance of respecting diverse aspirations.

Trustee Linda Lunn acknowledged National Counselors week and shared her appreciation for all the school counselors. Mrs. Lunn reported on the many activities and school events she attended, including the AAPAC meeting celebrating Black History Month, and highlighted the start of the Winter Guard season. She shared her experiences touring the Poway Unified School District Design 39 campus, which emphasizes skill mastery over traditional grades and assessments, and participating in the Navy Nimitz virtual reality experience at Vista Murrieta High School.

Trustee Nicholas Pardue reported spending a significant amount of time speaking with constituents and gathering more information from district staff about the bond. He said he was impressed by the Dorothy McElhinney Middle School dance group and had discussions with teachers and the principal about academic challenges, particularly in math and science, during his site visit. Mr. Pardue spoke about the importance of education in addressing social issues like systemic racism and expressed concerns about racial injustice in the district. He expressed concerns about sportsmanship, clubs and curriculum, advocating for a more diverse and inclusive approach to instruction to ensure all students' needs are being met, and they are fully prepared for future endeavors.

Trustee Nancy Young spoke about the Rotary Club speech and music contests and the upcoming International Women's Day event. Mrs. Young attended the AAPAC meeting celebrating Black History Month, visited the Poway Unified School District Design 39 Campus, which she said is a unique K-8 school focused on interconnected learning, participated in the Nimitz virtual reality experience, and attended a superintendent student advisory council meeting.

Trustee Paul Diffley spoke about current and upcoming high school drama presentations and said he is looking forward to attending as many of them as possible. Mr. Diffley said he had been spending time researching Career Technical education courses. He also said he had received several recommendations that high school seniors should be able to pass the US citizenship test as part of their graduation requirements. Mr. Diffley concluded by thanking the Board members for their conversation and thoughts.


