This seal begins with the Class of 2026. This form is due by the end of the seventh semester of the student's senior year. There will be no exceptions.

In order to obtain the Shawnee High School Student Engagement Seal, students must first complete 45 hours through student engagement (participation in sports, extracurriculars, etc.) and/or community service as this is a Shawnee HS graduation requirement. These 45 hours must be logged through the Shawnee HS Community Service/Student Engagement online form that can be found on the Guidance webpage.

Upon completion of the 45 hour graduation requirement, students have the option to obtain the student engagement seal by earning 15 additional student engagement hours through approved school activities. This form is due by the end of the seven semesters of the student's senior year. There will be no exceptions. *NOTE: It is strongly recommended that students do not wait until senior year to complete this form.*

Most sports seasons, extra-curriculars, and opportunities (i.e. teacher aide) are worth 15 hours, as long as the student has attended and participated in meetings, practices, performances, and has met daily expectations. If a student does not participate at least 90% of the time, the advisor has the right to deny the student the approved hours. Once this form is completed, the student will turn it in to their counselor who will enter the Student Engagement Seal on the transcript. This form will be placed in the student's cumulative file for verification purposes.

Shawnee High School Community Service Seal

This seal begins with the Class of 2026. This approval form, reflection questions and log are due by the end of the first semester of the student's senior year. There will be no exceptions.

In order to obtain the Shawnee High School Community Service Seal, students must first complete 45 hours through student engagement (participation in sports, extracurriculars, etc.) and/or community service as this is a Shawnee HS graduation requirement. These 45 hours must be logged through the Shawnee HS Community Service/Student Engagement online form that can be found on the Guidance webpage.

Upon completion of the 45 hour graduation requirement, students have the option to obtain the community service seal by earning 15 additional community service hours at an approved location. Before students can begin to earn their community service hours toward the seal, they must complete the approval portion of this form. The proposal page of this form must be completed by the end of the junior year in order to earn the seal. *NOTE: It is strongly recommended that students do not wait until their junior year to propose how they will earn their 15 additional hours.* The deadline to earn their 15 additional community service hours is at the end of the first semester of their senior year. There will not be any exceptions.

Upon approval of the student's community service proposal, the student will need to keep track of their hours through the log that is provided with this form.

- The student is expected to log the dates, number of hours, and daily responsibilities.
- The student must also make sure that the supervisor verifies that information listed each day on the log is accurate.
- This log is the student's attendance record which needs to be submitted to their advisory teacher at the completion of the community service hours.
- In addition to the log, the student is required to answer the reflection questions that are listed with this form.
- If either the log or reflection questions are missing, the student will not earn the seal.
- Both items are due by the end of the first semester of the student's senior year. As stated before, there will be no exceptions.

Once the advisory teacher has reviewed and approved the community service log and reflection questions, the school counselor will review the documents and add the Shawnee Community Service Seal to the student's transcript. The paperwork will be placed in the student's cumulative file.

Clark-Shawnee Spectator Code of Conduct:

Clark-Shawnee Local Schools, in association with the Ohio High School Athletic Association, promotes a positive interscholastic experience. The Board of Education believes that activities conducted for the benefit of the students of the School District are a meaningful component of the School District's total program. The Board further believes that through the participation in these activities, students learn important skills and values which will be of benefit throughout their lives. It is clear that both participants and spectators contribute to the educational value of these activities through good sportsmanship, and therefore, it is expected from athletes, coaches, officials, and spectators. Student and adult spectators should set an example of positive encouragement while supporting participants and modeling good behavior. Spectators should be respectful of their surroundings by using appropriate language and demonstrating responsibility for their actions.

Instances of disruptive behavior on the part of spectators at events lessens the educational value of the activity and results in a loss of esteem for the participants and the members of the community. These actions include but are not limited to the following: verbal comments directed at officials, players, coaches, opposing fans, and administrators; hand gestures or physical gestures that are deemed inappropriate; throwing of any objects towards the playing field or at other fans; failure to comply with requests made by administrators or site managers. Therefore, the Board of Education expects both participants and spectators at events to conduct themselves with the highest level of decorum. To this end, the Superintendent, Principal, Assistant Principal, Athletic Director, Student Resource Officer, Official, Site Manager, or Designee under whose supervision the event is being conducted, may request such person or group of persons, who are engaging or participating in unsatisfactory behavior to cease, and/or to leave the school premises. The supervisor on duty may take reasonable action to ensure the orderly conduct of the event.

Failure to meet the expectations set forth, culminating in ejection from an event or other actions deemed inappropriate by the administration or designee, either home or away, will result in the following disciplinary actions. (Suspensions apply to both home and away events):

First Offense: The spectator is banned from attending any Clark-Shawnee Athletic event for a period of ten (10) school days. During the ban from athletic events, the individual is required to meet with school administration to review the school's expectations. Failure to meet with the administrative team during this period will result in an extended ban from athletic events until the spectator meets with District Administration. If the ejection occurs within the last ten (10) school days of the season, the suspension will carry over to the tournament or to the next sport season. A letter will be sent from the office of the Superintendent notifying the spectator of the ejection and the dates he/she is prohibited to attend district athletic events.

Second Offense: The spectator is banned from attending any Clark-Shawnee Athletic event for a period of one (1) calendar year from the date of the 2nd offense. All other requirements set forth in the first offense also apply.

Third Offense: The spectator is banned from attending any Clark-Shawnee Athletic events for a period of five (5) calendar years, from the date of the 3rd offense. All other requirements set forth in the first offense also apply.

Fourth Offense: The spectator receives a lifetime ban from all Clark-Shawnee Athletic events. A letter will be sent from the office of the Superintendent notifying the spectator of the ejection and the lifetime removal from all Clark-Shawnee athletic events.

Appeals Process: Any spectator who has been ejected can appeal the decision in writing to the Superintendent who will schedule a meeting to consider the decision within five (5) business days following receipt of the appeal. The meeting will take place at a time and location as determined by the Superintendent. The Superintendent will issue a written decision following the appeal hearing and the decision of the Superintendent shall be final.

While learning and exploring is our focus for this trip, the safety of the students is our number one priority. BRT ensures that motor coach operators adhere to the strict USDOT standards for safety. They offer professional liability insurance and a consumer protection plan as recommended by the Student & Youth Travel Association. BRT will hire a security chaperone to be at the hotel with us. They also offer their own app- BRT Moments that Matter App. The features of this app include:

- **It tracks** – Once student travelers are connected, the app geo-tracks the students as they're out exploring. If for some reason a student misses a meet-up time, it's easy to figure out where they are on the map.
- **It makes communication quick and easy** – Directors/teachers can send individual messages to students OR send an update to the entire group.
- **It's private** – Without using email addresses or phone numbers, travelers can upload and share photos taken on tour with each other as well as family and friends back home. After the trip, the app generates a keepsake video of all the trip photos.

This trip is scheduled for the week after the Ohio state testing window closes to avoid any conflicts with state testing. It is also a week before graduation, so seniors would be eligible to attend. Parent chaperones will be welcome to attend at the same cost as the students. Our goal is for a 10:1 student-to-chaperone ratio maximum.
