

WIN Work Ready Credential

WIN Work Ready Credential is a workforce education and development tool, comprised of 3 assessments:

1. Work-Ready Math
2. Work Ready Reading
3. Work Ready Data

The assessments provide a customized credential that shows the learners/jobseekers have mastered the skills and are ready for work. The credential level is determined by the lowest score across all 3 tests. WIN Preparation Class will help students prepare to take the Ready to Work Assessment.

High School Diploma

(via VirtualSC and Edgenuity)

Registration: \$10

Class Fee: \$50

Diploma students must have a minimum of 12 viable credits. TABE results and evaluation of transcripts determine eligibility for the diploma program. Students must successfully complete the current diploma requirements set by the state of South Carolina in order to receive their diploma. Student must have access to a computer/laptop and Internet.

The Richland One Adult Education English as a Second Language (ESL) program is designed for students who want to develop their ability to understand, speak, read, and write English. Our students represent over 35 countries and 25 languages. Our teachers are well trained and have professional degrees in teaching ESL. During registration a student will complete an oral interview, and if he/she chooses to take our grammar class, he/she will complete a grammar test. Both tests will help in placing a student in the class level where they will be most successful. We offer classes for beginning, high beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels.

GED classes are available once ESL students successfully complete Grammar 4.

HSED

(High School Equivalency Diploma)

Formerly GED

HSED Preparation classes include both group and individual instruction to help prepare students to successfully pass the HSED tests. The HSED test is currently offered only on the computer. There are 4 tests: Reasoning Through Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Science, and Social Studies. Morning and evening classes are held at various sites in the community. Students must be at least 17 and cannot be enrolled in high school.
