According to Cyberpsychology and Research on Cyber Space articles, there are many consequences from cyberbullying, such as depression symptoms (like constant sadness, isolation, and disinterest), self injurious behaviors, anti-social behavior, anxiety and suicidal thoughts. In some of the worst cases, cyber bullies can face a

penalty of fines ranging from \$1,000-\$2,000, or imprisonment between six months and six years.

#### My Quarantine


