UNDERCLASSMEN EXAM INFO AND SCHEDULE

FINAL EXAM PROCEDURES

The administration of the final exams for all underclassmen will take place during <u>June 6, 2025 through June 13, 2025.</u> All students are expected to be present for their examination. The schedule for the exams has been posted on the school website as well as throughout the school for students to take notice. The exam schedule is also listed below.



All final exams will take place in the Main Gym. <u>All morning exams</u>
will start promptly at 8:30 am and all afternoon exams will start promptly at 11:30 am. The
minimum time allowed for each exam is 1 hour and 30 minutes. The maximum time allowed for
each exam is 2 hours and 30 minutes.

All students should enter through the doors near the Auditorium on LaSalle Ave and wait in the foyer by the Campus Store until allowed entry for the exam. No students should enter through the gymnasium!

Students are expected to continue to follow the rules of the St. Francis High School Student Handbook. Students may receive behavioral consequences including detentions for any misbehavior before, during, and/or after the administration of the exams while on campus. Students should be respectful of those taking the exams while on campus. If students decide to venture off campus they are reminded that they still represent St. Francis High School. Every student should be sensitive to the reputation of St. Francis High School in the local community and refrain from any form of public misconduct or illegal behavior that will tarnish his own reputation and that of the school. Any reports made to school administrators of student misconduct or unacceptable behavior are liable to disciplinary action.

Please note that transportation for exam week will be at the normal times both in the morning and afternoon. The Student Dining Room will be open in the morning for breakfast ONLY. THERE ARE NO MID-DAY BUSES. Additionally, all students must follow the dress code during the exams. The rules for the dress code are listed below. FINAL EXAM DRESS CODE:

The following will apply during the exams:

- Students MUST wear a St. Francis Polo
- Students may **ONLY** wear either dress shorts or dress pants; **NO** jeans, sweatpants, or gym shorts
- Students may **ONLY** wear casual shoes, sneakers, or dress shoes
