It's playoff time! The CVHS baseball team, boys lacrosse team, softball team, and several athletes on the track and field team have qualified for postseason competition.

The track and field athletes will compete at the District 3 championships on May 16 and 17 while the CVHS baseball team opens postseason play at Twin Valley on May 16. The boys lacrosse team squares off against Penn Manor on May 16, as well, and the softball squad opens play on Monday, May 19.

All tickets, once they become available, must be purchased online through Hometown ticketing. There will be absolutely no cash tickets available for purchase. When purchasing tickets, you must provide a valid email address where the ticket will be sent. The other option to purchase a ticket is through the Hometown Ticketing Fan app.

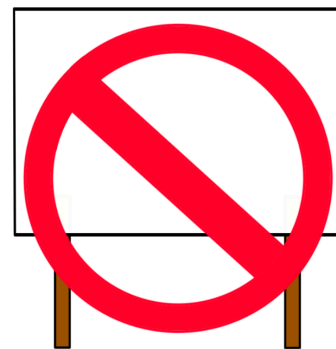


Every few years, CV asks for feedback from staff and families about district communication - what's working, what could be improved, etc. And it's time for another survey!

New Signage Guidelines



CV has recently enacted new guidelines regarding signage on campus. Keep reading for the details!

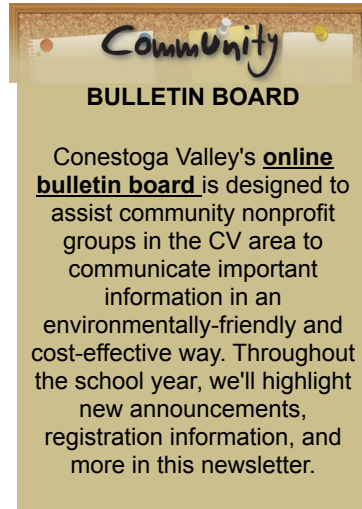
The Conestoga Valley School District (CVSD) prohibits the placement of signage on school property by outside groups. This includes, but is not limited to, yard signs and banners. If signage is placed on school grounds, the District has the right to remove said signage. Signage can be picked up at the main office of the school/building at which the signage was placed. Signs will be held at the main office for two weeks before being disposed of.

Exceptions:

- *Directional/parking signage for events.* Signage is permitted beginning one day prior to the event and

must be removed from district property at the conclusion of the event.

- *Third party signage.* Any third-party contractor of the District must request permission from CVSD prior to placing any signage by calling 717-397-2421 x0007 or emailing Kathryn_Odell@conestogavalley.org.
