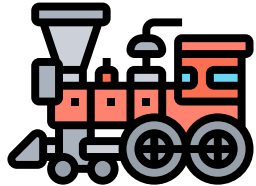

- Coordinate when appropriate, with other community agencies to support family needs.

As families, you will...

- Send your student(s) to school daily, on time, rested and with their school supplies.
- Support school rules.
- Ensure student's homework is done and papers are signed and returned on time.
- Participate in Parent Focus Groups and Conferences.
- Attend School-wide Family nights.
- Volunteer at school, when possible.
- Join the PTA.
- Ask for help or assistance as needed, examples include school supplies, winter jackets, translated documents, etc.
- Supervise/Monitor child's time; examples include use of electronics, daily independent reading time, sports, etc.

As a student, you will...

- Attend school daily and be on time.
- Be prepared for each subject and return papers signed on time.
- Stay focused on the teacher and the work given.
- Read every day.
- Accept responsibility for your own actions and work to be kind to everyone.
- Share the school day with a parent or family member at home.
- Follow school and classroom rules.
- Ask for supplies and help when needed.
