### St. Helens School District Welcomes Dr. Koreen Barreras-Brown as New Superintendent

"I am honored to join the St. Helens community and look forward to working alongside students, staff, and families to create exceptional environments where everyone feels valued, supported, and empowered," said Dr. Barreras-Brown. "Together, we will continue to build inclusive, equitable, and high-achieving schools for all."



With over two decades of experience in education and 15 years in leadership roles, including five years as a superintendent, Dr. Barreras-Brown brings a strong record of innovation, equity, and student-centered leadership to the district.

Dr. Barreras-Brown began her educational career as a 7th-grade Language Arts teacher in the Cumberland County School District. Her dedication to inclusive learning and social-emotional support led her into leadership positions, beginning with her role as an Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education (EI/ECSE) Supervisor in the Multnomah Early Childhood Program.

In 2016, Dr. Barreras-Brown was appointed Superintendent of the Colton School District, where she successfully implemented an equity-focused framework that supported multitiered systems of support (MTSS) for both academic growth and social-emotional learning. Under her leadership, graduation rates significantly increased across all student demographics.

Most recently, she served as Chief Academic Officer for Reynolds School District, overseeing all aspects of teaching and learning. There, she led professional development initiatives in the Science of Reading, Student-Centered Coaching, Sheltered Instruction, Linguistically Culturally and Responsive Teaching, strategies that yielded measurable student achievement gains in engagement.

Dr. Barreras-Brown holds a Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership for Social Justice from Lewis & Clark College. She also earned a Master of Arts in Special Education from Fayetteville State University and a Master of Public Administration with a focus on Human Resources from City University of Seattle.


