I designed the layout, cover, and found all the photos at the Minnesota Historical Society. You upload it to amazon and they sell it on the website. You make more per book this way, but the disadvantage is it's not available for purchase

in local bookstores like Barnes And Noble like the first book was.

How did you organize your information in a book? Is it different from an essay?





"Yay Mom, we get to go home now!" the girls shouted happily.


"No, no, no, no! You don't get to leave!" the Queen of Hearts screamed.

"Yes, we do! This is our decision!" Alice yelled back.


Then POOF! They were back in their world.

Q: What is your favorite movie?




Q: What is your dream travel destination?

A: "Disney does a trip where you can travel all around the world and go to every single Disney park. My dream would be to take that trip and travel around the world seeing all the different Disney parks."


Q: What is your favorite holiday?
