### Georgia Special Needs Scholarships: SB10 and SB47

**What:** Under state laws passed by the Georgia State Legislature, parents of students who receive special education services or accommodations under a Section 504 Individual Accommodation Plan may request to transfer their child to another public or private school in Georgia.

**Who:** Any student who currently receives special education services, grades PK-11th and any returning 12th grader, as well as students who are eligible for a Section 504 Plan and are in grades Kindergarten-11th.


Parents will be responsible for paying the remaining \$50.00. Scholarship funds are for currently enrolled Simonton ES students only.



### Medication

Students may **NOT** carry medication of any kind to school. For student safety, we need to be aware of the medication and dosage in case there are any adverse reactions. The clinic worker is authorized to administer medications to students when proper paperwork is completed. Medications should always be in the original containers when brought to or picked up from school by an adult. **Medication may not be brought to school by a student**. These procedures are a safety precaution for your child, both on the bus and when they visit the clinic.

## Counselor's Corner

### Who has the Black Knight?

We started a new attendance incentive program this year called, "Who has the black knight?" Every other week the counselors get on the announcements and ask the students "Who has the black knight? Students look under their desks and see if they have it. Students that have the black knight receive a prize. If a student is absent or was tardy to school, they wouldn't receive the prize. This program is a reminder to students that coming to school and being on time is very important.



### SWAG:

As an attendance incentive, classes are rewarded when everyone in class is present. They earn letters to spell **SWAG** which stands for Student Weekly Attendance Goals. Once this is achieved, they earn a popsicle party. They can earn two more popsicle parties a semester by earning the letters to spell **BLACK** and **KNIGHTS**.

This group provides advice, suggests alternative teaching strategies or interventions to support the students in meeting grade level expectations.

## **Elementary Parent e-Tips**

### Collect your child's accomplishments in a special box

Feeling capable motivates children to take on challenges. One way to help your child recognize personal strengths is to make an accomplishments box. Decorate a shoebox and label it with your child's name. Cut a slot in the lid. Throughout the year, write your student's accomplishments, large and small, on slips of paper and put them in the box. ### To make sense of nonfiction reading, spin a 'reading web' together

If your child struggles to make sense of nonfiction reading, drawing a "reading web" before even beginning to read may help. Have your student write down the title of the chapter or passage and draw lines branching out from it. Next, have your child preview the text and write each section heading on a different branch. While reading, your child can branch subheadings out from each section heading. This type of diagram shows students how details support the main idea.

### Junk mail can be a great teaching tool

Before you toss junk mail, have your child examine it to find out where it came from. Then, help your student locate and mark that place on a map. Does more mail come from certain areas? You can also have your child sort the junk mail in a variety of ways: by state, region or how far its origin is from your home. Which piece traveled the longest distance? ### Logical consequences reinforce responsibility

Learning to carry out instructions is part of developing responsibility, at home and at school. Instead of repeating commands over and over, stop telling and start doing. If you've asked your child to empty pockets before putting pants in the laundry basket, wash only the pants with empty pockets. ### Create a family motto that inspires persistence

It isn't always easy for children to persevere in tough situations. One way to inspire your child to keep trying is by creating a family motto that expresses this idea. It could be something like, "In our family, we stick with it until it's done." Have family members make suggestions and decide together on a motto. Repeat the motto often.
