AZ Compass Prep School Guidelines for F-1 International Students

- F-1 students should be under 18 years of age or younger prior to the start of their senior year.
- F-1 students are required to pay the school the full cost of education by repaying the school system for the full, unsubsidized, per capita cost of providing the education to him or her. Please see international tuition and required fees.
- Students who need support with home placement services, supervision of their experience in the US (including cultural trips) and specialized training in our Sports Leadership Academy, may be required to pay additional funds.
- Foreign visa students are limited to 12 months of study in public schools. After one year at AZ Compass Prep School, students can transfer to a private high school or enroll in college if appropriate.
- Foreign visa students must not have already completed high school or a high school equivalent.
- Foreign student may have not received an F-1 Visa from another SEVP certified public school during their high school career.
- Students are required to submit their TOEFL or alternate English test score along with their application if requested.
- Host Guardian or Family is responsible to come to AZ Compass Prep School in person to submit the student application to receive I-20 or will have to schedule an online call if not available in person.
- If student is requesting AZ Compass assist in arranging a host guardian or family, please contact discuss with Academic Dean during interview.
- Once approved, student will receive an I-20 and student and/or Host Family are responsible for paying I-20 fee directly to US Immigration and Customs Enforcement. www.fmjfee.com.
- High school diplomas are not guaranteed. Students must meet all AZCP course requirements and pass the Arizona High School Exit Examination to graduate. Prior coursework may be accepted and AZCP classes assigned based on a transcript evaluation at the school requested.

F-1 International Admissions Process for AZ Compass Prep School

- Set up appointment / interview with AZCP Academic Dean or Registrar.
- Complete application with application fee of \$450
- Authorization for Adult to Act as Custodial Parent (MUST be notarized) and designate host guardian.
- Request AZCP to support in identifying a host guardian and housing if you do not have this identified.
- TOEFL Score report IF APPLICABLE. We will also accept an IELTS (International English Language Testing System) report (using the General Training test) or an iTEP (International Test of English Proficiency) SLATE-Plus report.
- Specific scores may be required for admission (but may be waived by the Principal under certain circumstances).
- Copy of Student Birth Certificate
- Copy of Student Passport and Parent Passport (required)
- Student transcripts or record of courses taken translated into English from 9th grade forward.
- Host guardian or parent must provide proof of residence in United States (unless you are working with AZCP on placement).
- Student's report of Health Examination and Immunization record – translated into English.
- Schedule in person or virtual interview.
- Once approved by AZCP (estimated 2 weeks), student will receive a letter of acceptance.
- Student will receive a full one-year F-1 Visa, all tuition must be prepaid with Cashier check to AZCP for the entire year prior to issuance of an I-20.
- Student may also request a half year F-1 Visa, with option to extend for the full year. Half year tuition fees and other fees if applicable with Cashier check to AZCP. Second Semester Fees are due 30 days prior to Second Semester Start.
- All living expenses arranged by AZCP will be due in conjunction with tuition payments.
- Student will be issued an I-20 upon receipt of funds.
- Student will need to go online and pay I-901 fee paid to Department of Homeland Security (after issuance of I-20). www.fmjfee.com.
- Complete Online Non-immigrant Visa Application (DS-160).

- Visa Interview with U.S. Consulate official must happen prior to entering US.
- Please be sure to arrive two weeks prior to beginning of school. You will receive a welcome packet prior to leaving and have a scheduled time to meet with school administration upon arrival. We look forward to meeting you.

Payment Information

Application Fee: The application fee covers the cost of the application, document preparation, and mailing of acceptance documents. The fee is non-refundable, even if the student is unable to obtain the appropriate visa. The deadline to apply for August admission (fall semester) is May 1. The deadline to apply for January admission (spring semester) is November 1. (Students may only transfer for the spring semester if they are currently enrolled in a U.S. high school.)

Food and Meals: This fee covers two meals per day during the week at school and food at home to ensure students are receiving adequate daily nutrition.

Basketball Leadership Academy: This fee covers all basketball clinics (one on one and team clinics), all annual competitive games in season, tournaments, travel, Skyline Education leadership development which includes education regarding NCAA, NAIA, college application submission, community involvement, university visits, video coverage of performance and assistance with potential placement in post-secondary schools and Universities.

Placement Services and Management: Housing is provided separately from the school. This fee includes the placement of student in a safe living environment with thorough vetting and continuous monitoring over living conditions. This also includes exposure to American culture, food, music, visits to local and regional landmarks, universities and creating a family bond for life.

Payment Schedule:

New Students: Tuition, Food and Meals, and other program fees (if applicable) are due upon receipt of the student's letter of acceptance and/or prior to issuance of I-20 or attendance.
