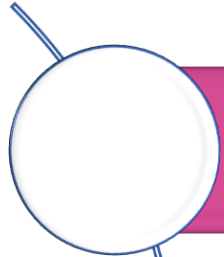

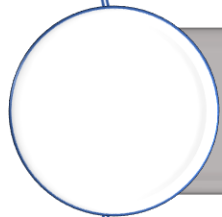

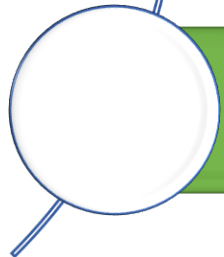
Data Context

The Q3 and Q4 data for SY23-24 covers the time period of January 2024-June 2024



Data presented is reflective of what Safety and Security Services collects. This presentation does not capture data collected by Student Services and Equity or Accountability and Research as it relates to student discipline or state reporting



Data Collection and Reconciliation

Incident Reporting

- Mandatory notifications sent by School Administrators post-incident
- In line with *SB Policy CLA*
- Incident reports *do not* always equate to a crime being committed
- Reconciled and logged by SSS once received

Call for Service Report Form (Police Assistance)

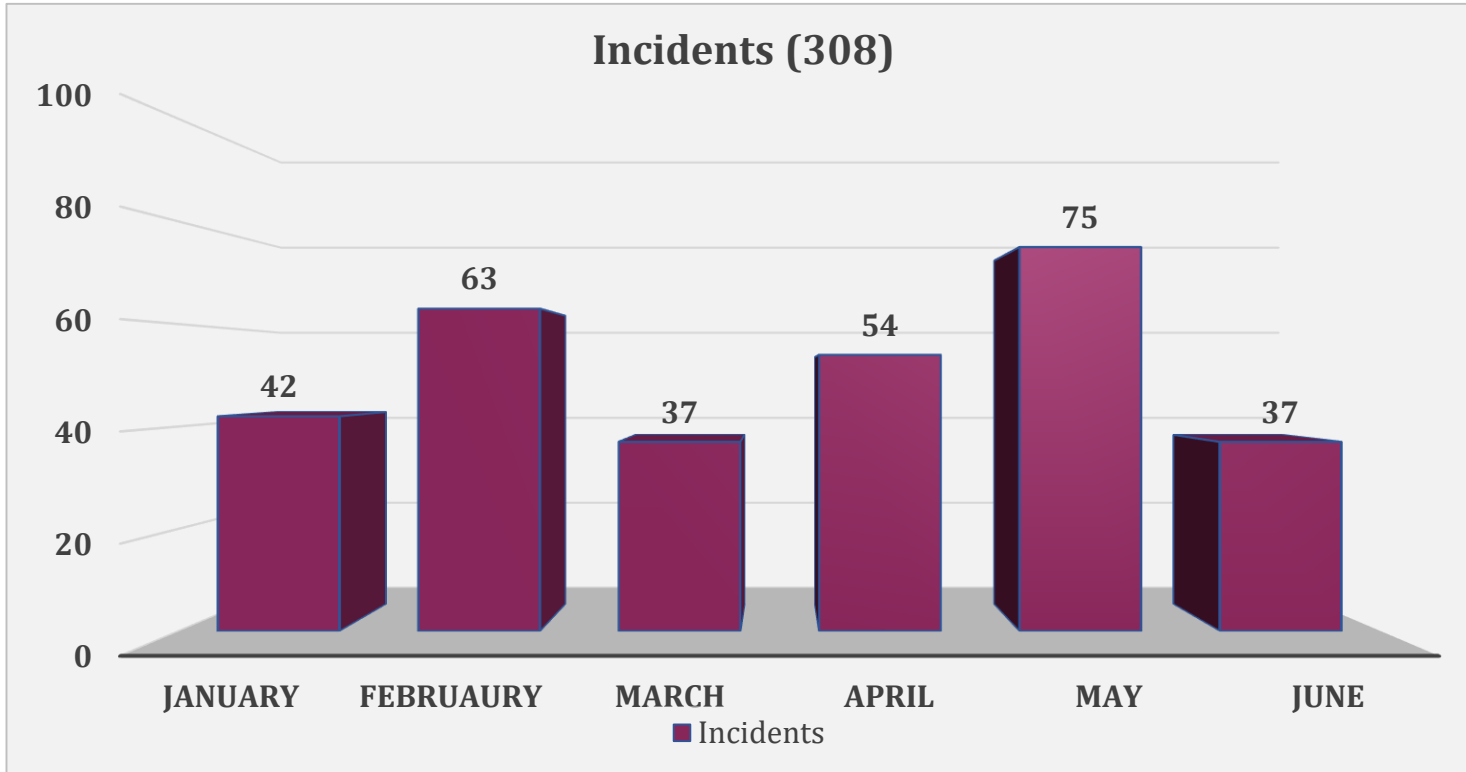
- Form completed by School Administrators when police assistance/support occurs
- In line with *July 1, 2023 SLEP MOU*.
- Reconciled and logged by SSS once received

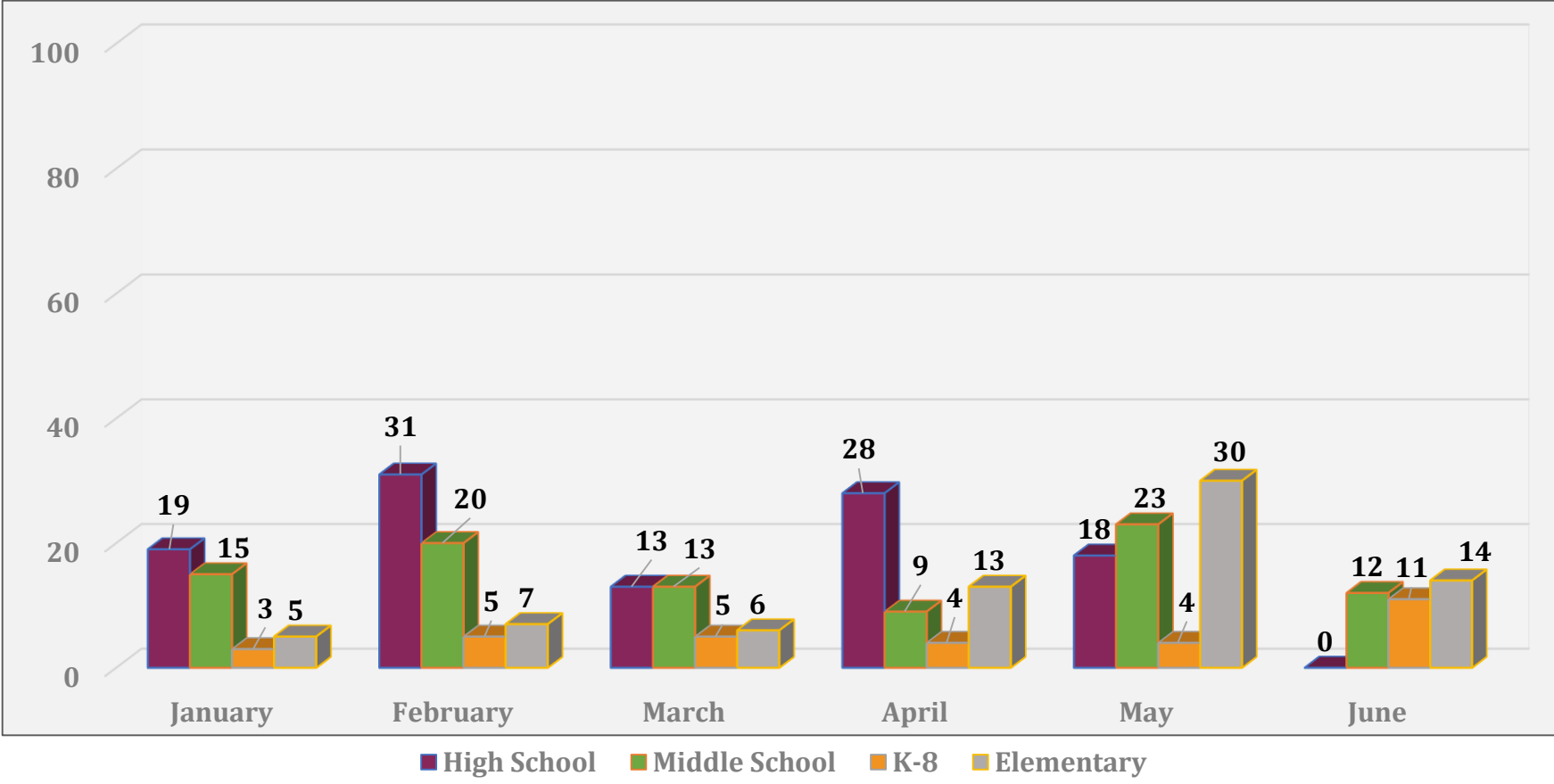

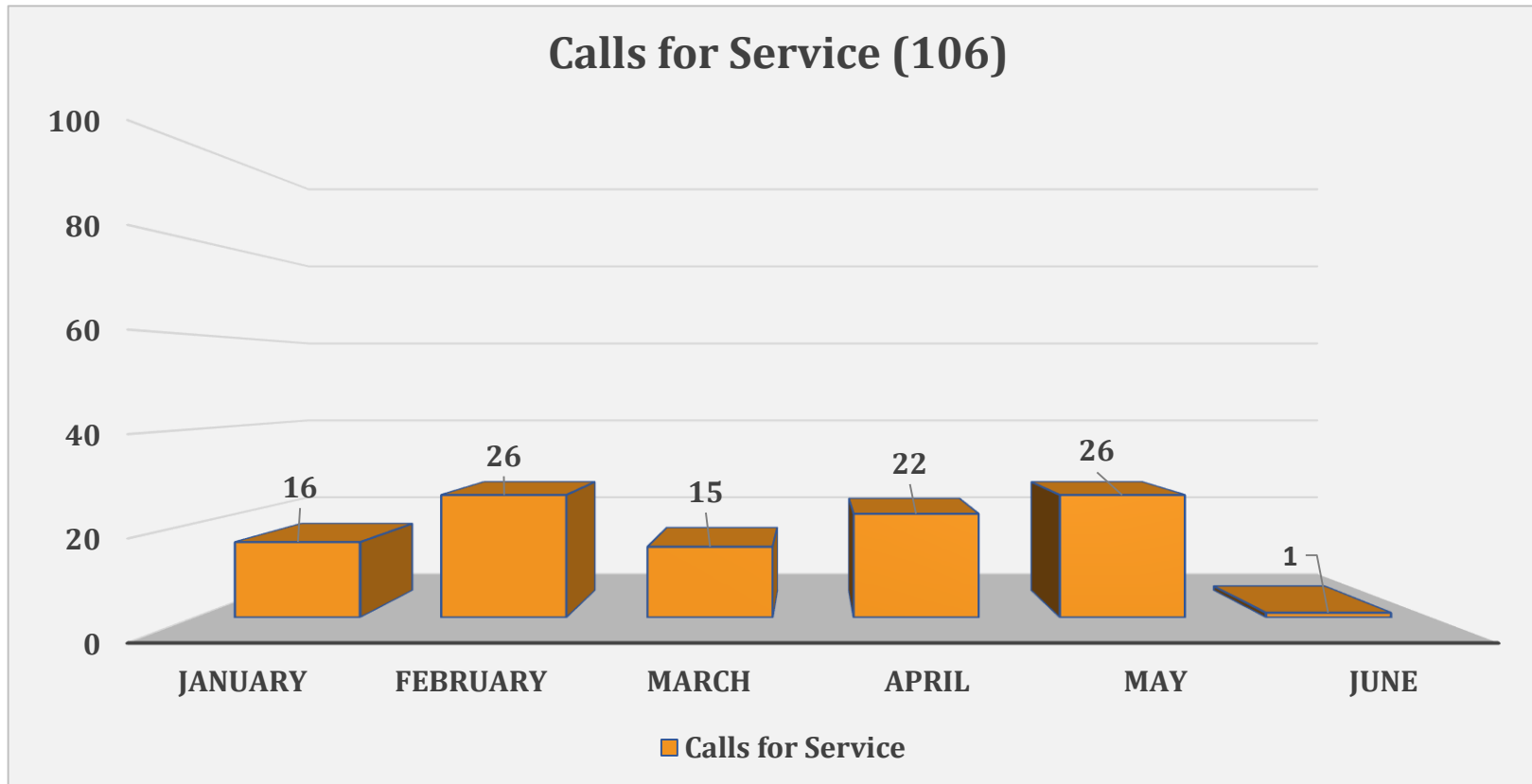

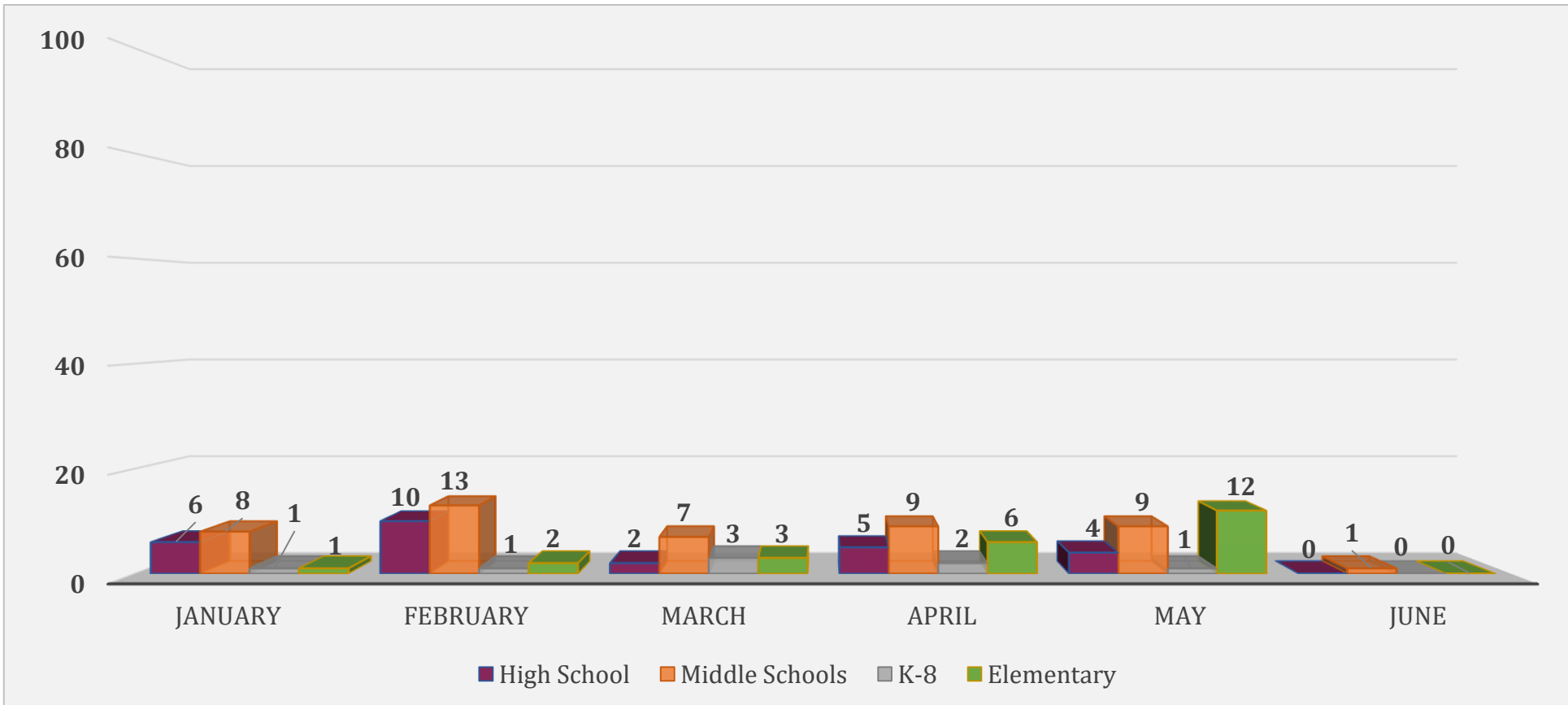
APD Calls for Service by Month, Q3 and Q4

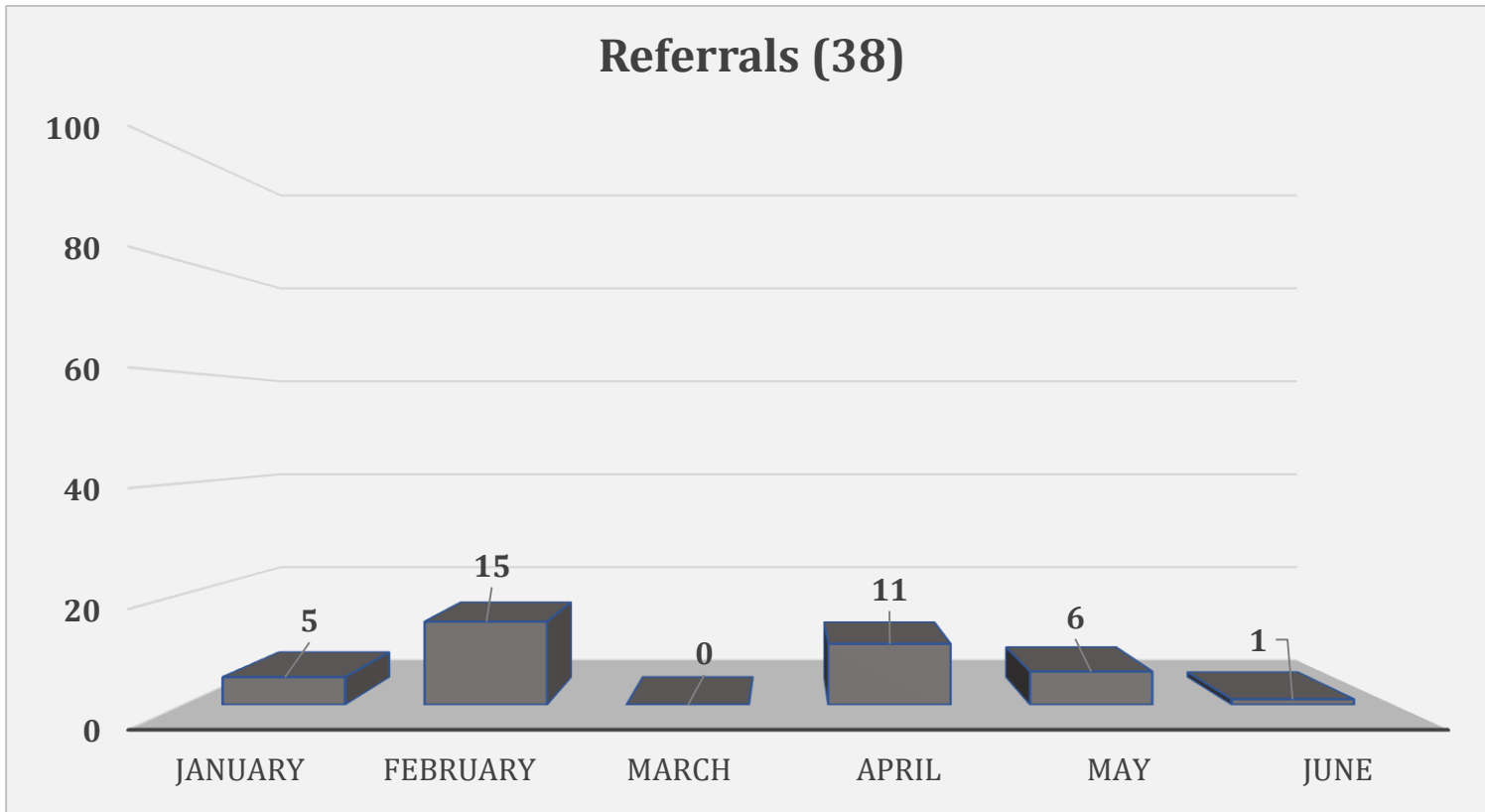

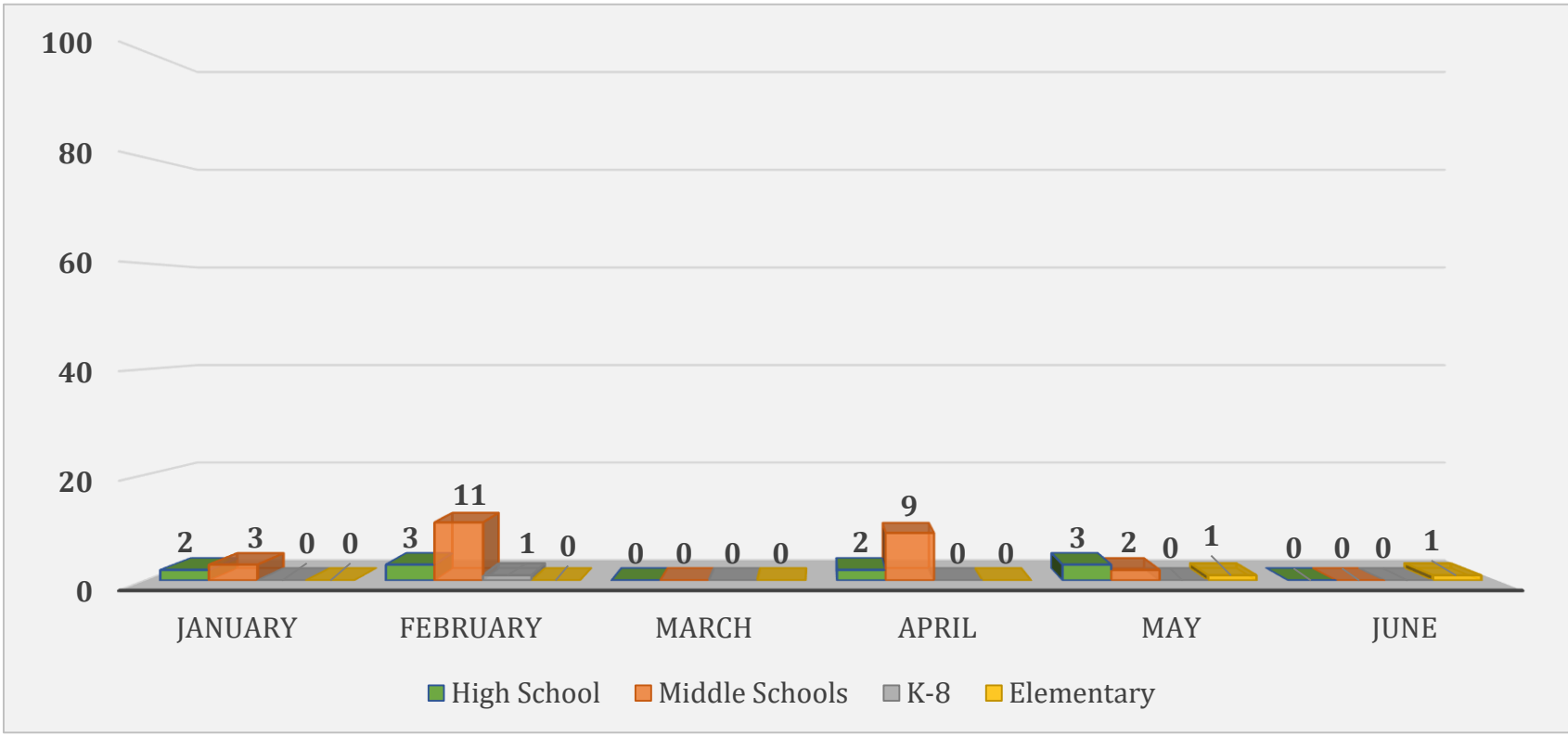

ACPS Student Enrollment Demographics:

- Asian: 6.6%
- Black: 24.0%
- Hispanic: 37.6%
- White: 27.2%
- Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander: 0.3%
- Native American: 0.1%
- Multi-racial: 4.2%

In an effort to better define composition of arrests, the ethnicity categories of "Hispanic or Latino" or "Non-Hispanic or Latino" have been updated and/or added.

Note: One referral at the high school level was a Male Non-Student, but counted in the total (10).



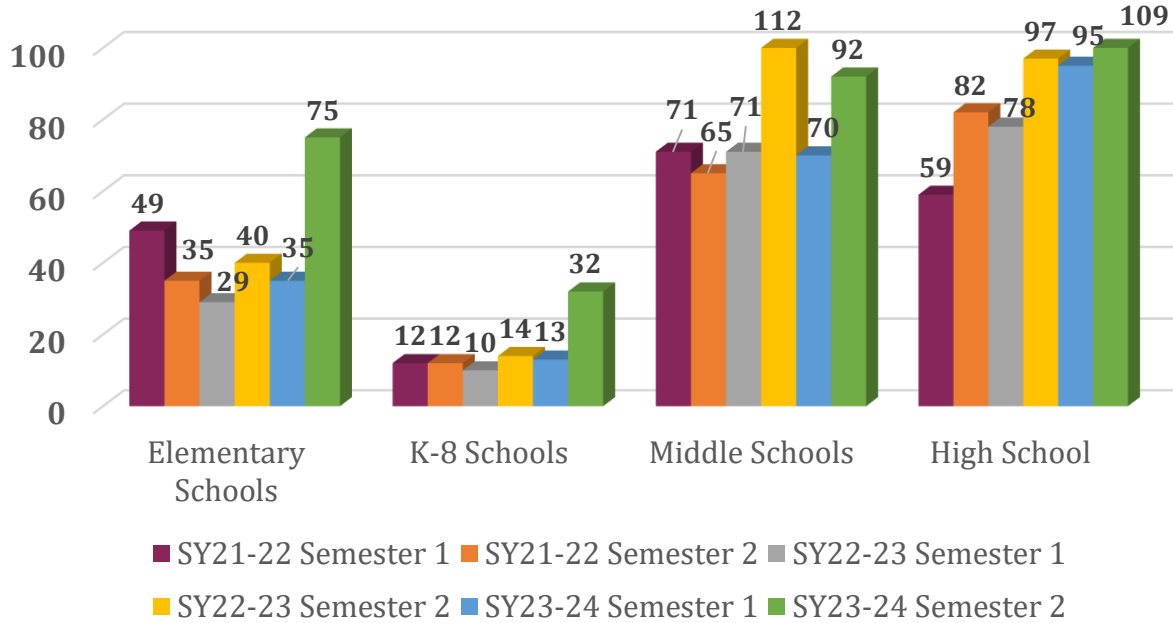

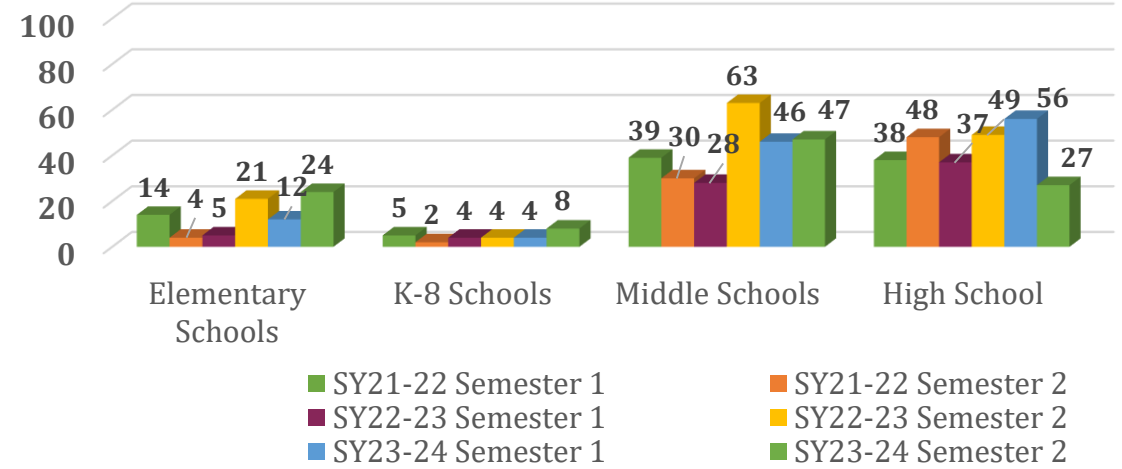


Data Comparison by School Type and Semester

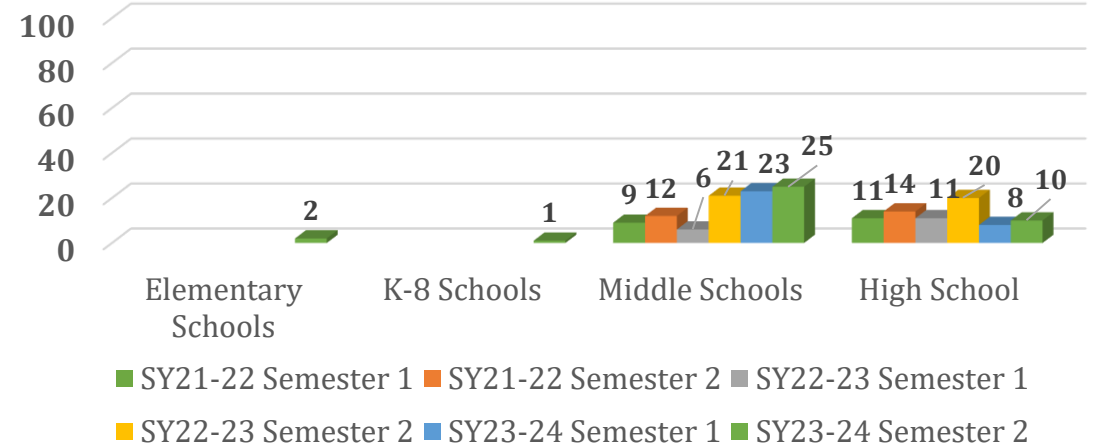
Incident Report Comparison
