R5240 TARDINESS

A. Definitions

- A pupil is tardy to school when the pupil reports to his/her assigned homeroom after the late bell rings without approval for the delay.
- 2. A pupil is tardy to class when the pupil reports to his/her assigned classroom or other place of instruction after the late bell rings without approval for the delay.
- 3. Pursuant to Board Policy 5230, a pupil who presents an acceptable excuse for being late to school or class is not tardy.

B. Procedures for Tardy Arrivals

- 1. A pupil who is tardy to school must report to the attendance office to sign in and receive a late pass for admission to homeroom or class.
- 2. A pupil who is tardy to class may be required by the teacher to obtain a late pass from the attendance office for admission to class.
- 3. The attendance office may request from the student or his/her parent an explanation for the student's tardy arrival.
- 4. A student's tardiness shall be excused if the student presents a late pass verifying that he or she was tardy as a consequence of being detained by a teacher or other staff member.
- 5. Only an administrator, nurse or guidance counselor may excuse a student from class during the school day.

C. Disciplinary Consequences

Students are expected to come to school and class on time every day.

- 1. A tardy arrival to class may be treated as a class cut if the student misses more than half the class period.
- 2. The consequence for three (3) tardy arrivals to school or to any one class shall be a written warning to the student's parents and one (1) forty-minute detention before or after school, or at lunch.
- 3. The consequence for five (5) tardy arrivals to school or to any one class shall be a mandatory parental conference with the school principal or classroom teacher and two (2) detentions before or after school, or at lunch.
- 4. Five (5) instances of unexcused tardiness are equal to one unexcused absence from school or class for the purpose of course credit, grade promotion, and graduation.
- 5. For each additional instance of tardiness beyond the fifth, the consequence shall be one (1) forty-minute detention before or after school, or at lunch.
