## "Change For Change" Collection Receives Strong Support

School No. 7 Principal Pamela Powell introduced the dignitaries before calling Camila Izaguirre from her seat for the surprise donation.

Superintendent Newell said, "Camila is an incredible person. She has shown so much strength, determination, and maturity for someone of her age. My hopes are that this donation from North Jersey Federal Credit Union will inspire more people to give to the collection."

NJFCU President and CEO Richard Garcia said, "We've been partners with the Paterson Public Schools system for many years. We wanted to help contribute to Camila's very import cause."
