VOLUNTEER HOURS & OBLIGATIONS

All hours must be completed and entered through your FACTS Family Portal account by this Saturday, May 27, 2023, or your amount due will be added to your FACTS account for June withdrawal.

As a reminder:

- Each family is required to complete 30 hours of parent service to the school this year.
- Your account will be charged \$20.00 for each uncompleted hour, not to exceed \$600 for the school year. Service hours are part of your family's tuition contract (Policy 6530), and as such, need to be completed, or paid for, by the end of the academic year.
- Families may pay for their total hours or current balance any time before the end of the school year.

SUMMER HOMEWORK

There are summer homework requirements for math and reading. Summer homework will help keep the students' minds active and sharp this summer. Summer homework packets are being sent home with your student this week. If they do not make it home, the packets will be available in our front office the week of June 9. All students are required to complete the homework packet for the grade they will be entering for the 2025-2026 school year. Packets will need to be handed in on Monday, August 11.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UPDATE

Thank you for your understanding with the delay in getting tuition contracts updated. The change in management to the Utah Fits All Scholarship program has delayed this process. We will begin sending out contracts next week with payment options. Initially the contracts will show the tuition pending without the UFA Scholarship. *Once you have received a notification from Odyssey regarding your UFA status, you need to send the confirmation email to the school.* Upon receiving notification, the tuition contract will be adjusted to reflect the scholarship. If you do not receive a UFA scholarship we will work with you on your tuition based on your FACTS Grant & Aid application. Tuition payments for 2025-2026 school year will begin August 2025 and go through May 2026 unless you have made other arrangements with Mrs. Moffat.

TECHNOLOGY AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

Saint Olaf Catholic School is starting an after-school technology program for the 2025-2026 school year. Students joining will work collaboratively in our new Discovery Lab to learn the Principles of Computational & Algorithmic Thinking, learn programming, delve into the realms of micro/circuit python, and learn to assemble basic circuitry & digital controls.
