

CCPS Learning Express Bus






Migrant In-Home Literacy

Title IV, Part A

Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grant

Purpose: To improve student academic achievement by increasing the capacity of state and districts in the following areas:

- providing all students with access to a **well-rounded education**,
 - improving school conditions for student learnings to support **safe and healthy students**, and
 - improving the **use of technology** in order to advance digital literacy of all students
- Title IV, Part A provisions include a 15% technology cap and the 20% spending requirements for each well-rounded educational opportunities and safe and healthy learning conditions.
 - Collier's allocation for 2024-2025 is **\$934,752.20**.



Title IV Grant Activities

CCPS provides the following initiatives in 2024-2025:

- Supplemental positions: Two District Transition Counselors; Immokalee High School Counselor, Golden Gate High Resource Teacher for Social Studies; Immokalee High Resource Teacher for ELA/Science; Lely High Parent Involvement Assistant



McKinney-Vento Program

What is McKinney-Vento Program?

- The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Program is designed to address the barriers that children and youth, who are experiencing homelessness, may face during enrollment, attendance, or in succeeding in school
- Another words, it is a federal law that guarantees homeless children and youth the right to immediate enrollment in school and access to a free, appropriate public education, ensuring educational stability despite their housing situation; it essentially ensures homeless students receive the same educational opportunities as other students.

McKinney-Vento Program

Who Qualifies?

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters
- Have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used, as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations or similar settings.
- **Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.**
- Unaccompanied youth – A homeless child or youth, who is not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.

Head Start - Free full day program for families that qualify

Half a day- 3-hour VPK (No cost to parent)


Full Day VPK Program combined with Parent Pay Option VPK

Pre-School Disabilities/Exceptional Student Education



Head Start

- The Head Start program is available to children of disadvantaged families and requires pre-approval. Children in foster care and families experiencing homelessness or house-sharing, receiving public assistance (TANF, SSI, SNAP), or earning below the Federal Poverty Guideline are encouraged to apply. This program is offered at multiple sites.



Voluntary Prekindergarten

- **Florida VPK is a free prekindergarten program for eligible children who turning 3 or 4 years old by September 1 during regular school year or summer before entering kindergarten.**



Full day VPK (combined with Parent Pay Option) The full day VPK program is limited to space availability and parents are responsible for additional fees. This program is offered at multiple sites.



Based at 2 schools with VPK only programs, and 19 schools with blended VPK/Head Start/ESE Inclusion classes




Half Day VPK at Sabal Palm Elementary School (NO COST TO PARENT) The 3-hour half day VPK program is limited to space availability and offers morning and afternoon sessions.




