

Overarching Goal

- The overarching goal of the MEP is to assist all migratory children in meeting challenging academic standards and achieving graduation from high school (or a high school equivalent diploma) with an education that prepares them for responsible citizenship, further learning, and productive employment.

 - High School Graduation
 - Early Childhood
 - Out-of-School Youth




Migrant Education Program Supports

MPAC Officer Elections

- **Nominations (OPEN)**
 - Submitted online or in paper.
- **Duration of Term: 3 years**
- **Officers** (must be a parent of eligible migratory child enrolled in CCPS):
 - President
 - Vice-president
 - Secretary
- **Parents of eligible migrant students elect officers by December 9th.**



MPAC Officer Responsibilities

President

The responsibilities of the president include:

- **Vote only in case of a tie.**
- **Be the president of the Executive Board.**
- **Appoint the Chairperson of standing committees and assist in the selection of committee members.**
- **Appoint special committees. (Ex. Scholarship, By-law reviews)**
- **Have such usual powers of supervision that pertain to the office of the President. The President, is an ex officio member of all committees, and shall have the power to replace a committee member should the need arise.**



MPAC Officer Responsibilities

Vice President

- The responsibility of the vice-president is to assist the President in his or her duties and shall preside in the absence of the President. In the absence of the secretary, the vice president will assume the duties of the secretary (taking notes) during the Migrant Parent Advisory Council Meetings and Migrant Parent Institutes.

Secretary

- The responsibility of the secretary is to take notes at Migrant Parent Advisory Council Meetings and Migrant Parent Institutes.



WELCOME TO THE LEARNING EXPRESS! The Learning Express mobile classroom provides services to Migrant students and families on evenings and weekends and during summer and holiday breaks. It visits locations in the community to provide tutoring services, a mobile hotspot, educational activities, and a lending library for students and families.

ACTIVITIES

ACT PREP & SAT PREP

High school students receive tutoring assistance in preparation for ACT or SAT tests (prep books provided)

FAMILY GAME NIGHT

Teachers facilitate educational family game night using program-provided games

HOMEWORK HELP

Teachers assist with homework and/or provide light tutoring on homework topics

LITERACY AND MATH TUTORING (K-5)

Teachers provide tutoring support in literacy and Math for elementary students

OPEN LAB/CHECK OUT

Students/families may come in to use laptops/Wi-Fi, seek tutoring assistance, assistance with canvas, check out books, or other needs

PARENT ENGLISH CLASSES

Teacher instructs parents on English language using the Future Curriculum from Pearson

PARENT INSTITUTE (various topics)

Parents learn strategies that will build capacity to assist their children with school

PRE-K LITERACY (ages 3-5)

Teacher provides early literacy instruction to pre-k aged students side-by side with parent



McKinney-Vento Program

• Who Qualifies?

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters
- Have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used, as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations or similar settings.
- **Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.**
- Unaccompanied youth – A homeless child or youth, who is not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.

English LANGUAGE Learner

- ELL
 - The English Language Learners (ELL) Program of the District School Board of Collier County has been serving students from multicultural backgrounds since 1984.
 - In 1984, the ELL Program had a total enrollment of 250 students.
 - Currently, there are over 7,000 students.
 - Monolingual and bilingual staff (administrators, teachers, and tutors) assist ELL students and their parents.



Why is your Child in the ELL Program?

- **Florida META Consent Decree of 1990**
 - When you registered your child for school you answered that another language other than English is spoken in your home.
 - If your child qualifies for the ELL Program, he/she is eligible to receive language support services.
 - A child is currently in the ELL program, needs support with all language areas, which are: listening, speaking, reading and writing.
 - In the meantime, your is learning all academic contents




ELL Student Services

- Title III Services
 - **ELL students receive additional English language support in the classroom so they can be academically successful.**
 - **They also receive test accommodations during statewide assessments.**
 - **They receive support in their classroom during regularly scheduled classes.**
