Year 11 – GCSE Exams in Full Swing

Our Year 11 students are now well underway with their GCSE examinations. We are incredibly proud of the commitment and determination they have shown throughout this crucial period. Staff continue to support pupils with additional revision sessions and wellbeing check-ins; a special thank you to those parents who have given such positive feedback – it is really appreciated!

We wish our students every success as they complete their final papers and look forward to celebrating their hard work at the school prom in June.

Year 10 – Work Experience Week

Year 10 students recently completed their work experience placements, gaining invaluable insights into the world of work. Feedback from employers has been overwhelmingly positive, with many praising the students' maturity, punctuality, and enthusiasm. Thank you to all families and businesses who supported this important programme.

KS3 – Summer Exams Completed

Students in Years 7 to 9 have now completed their first set of formal assessments. These exams help us monitor academic progress and identify areas for development. We are impressed by the focused attitude students displayed throughout the assessment period.

Celebrating Progress – Attendance & Behaviour

We are pleased to report a continued improvement in attendance figures across all year groups. Your support in ensuring that students attend regularly and punctually is greatly appreciated.

In response to our most recent Ofsted report, we have also taken significant steps to improve behaviour across the school. I am delighted to share that suspensions have seen a notable reduction compared to this time last year – a testament to our staff's hard work and our students' positive response.

Commemorating VE Day

This term we marked VE Day with assemblies and participation in the town events that helped students reflect on the importance of peace and resilience. It was wonderful to see so many students engaged in learning about this pivotal moment in history.

Educational Visits – Brighton & Normandy

Educational visits this term have included a Photography field trip to Brighton and a culturally enriching residential visit to Normandy. These experiences provided fantastic opportunities for students to develop independence and teamwork skills. We received a very lovely comment from a member of the public travelling on the ferry back from France, who was following the FA Cup Final on her phone. Sadly, her phone died before the game had finished.....

Around half an hour later the same two young men came to find me to tell me the final score What an absolute legend!! They chatted for a bit longer and told me about their trip before saying goodbye. What two absolute lovely young men, polite, courteous, and so lovely to go out of their way to seek me out.

Careers



It has been a busy term for Year 10 students as they embarked on a week of work experience. Companies such as Edwards Vacuum, Rose Media Group, Abcom, Acora, i2i Media, Ariel Theatre Company, Extech Cloud, American Express, Leap Environmental and Gatwick Airport all supported our programme providing a valuable first opportunity for students to investigate the working world. We received some amazing feedback from employers with comments such as;

Well done to all our Year 10 students who participated in a work experience programme, the skills that you have learnt will help you as you navigate college applications, interviews and the job application process. Several students received offers of part-time work and future apprenticeships.

There were also a small number of Year 10 students who were in school during work experience week. However, the work-related learning continued with visits from; The Army with a fantastic session on careers in the Army followed by team building exercises on the field, a mock assessment centre activity from Thales which was delivered by one of our alumni, Connor Murphy, a plumbing workshop from Steve Willis Training, a presentation on personal finance from Barclays Bank, a session on Making an Impact from an alumnus, Ben McLaren of KPMG. In addition to these, we were delighted to welcome representatives from The Rotary Club who conducted mock interviews with students. We finished the week with sessions of Forest School, kindly delivered by our fantastic Forest School teacher, Miss Dewey!









One of the teams of Year 8 students taking part in the BHAFC Social Enterprise Challenge were chosen to represent BHAFC at the Premier League Inspires Event at Wembley Stadium on Wednesday 23rd April. The project for this event was themed around raising awareness of gender equality and our team chose to create a video about gender bias in football. This was filmed just before the Easter holidays and students were excited to have the opportunity to display their project. There were student teams representing 41 Football teams from all over England. During the day, teams had the opportunity to visit other stands and see their projects, hear from ex-England player – Izzy Christensen about the barriers she has faced in her football career and most excitingly, have a tour of Wembley stadium including the changing rooms.

Despite being one of the youngest teams taking part (the age range was Yr 8-11), our students were excellent representatives of the academy, speaking to the press, discussing their project with other teams with great maturity and developing a greater understanding of the impact of gender bias. I was very proud to work with such amazing young people!

Ahead of exams next month, Year 10 students looked at how to answer the long exam/essay question in the final session of 4 in the Study Skills programme with the University of Brighton. During these sessions, we have considered various ways of revising, understanding command works and what an exam question is asking and how to create a revision timetable. The Year 10 exam results will be required by colleges during interviews in the Autumn term as a means of assessing student's abilities. These sessions have provided students with key skills to achieve their potential in these exams.

Ten Year 8 girls took part in a event run by Edwards Vacuum aimed at increasing female engagement in STEM careers. Students took part in a carousel of activities; the bell jar experiment, a site tour, a practical activity with a vacuum pump, an experiment with vacuum and ping pong balls and most excitingly, a



chance to understand how AR (Augmented Reality) and VR (Virtual Reality) are used to support technicians at Edwards Vacuum. The girls were enthusiastic, engaged and with lots of fantastic questions for the business volunteers. They were particularly impressed with the business networking lunch supplied by the company! Some definite future engineers in the making.





Finally, we end the term with a series of Aspiration workshops for selected Year 8 students with our career's advisor, Carl from Elev8Careers, looking at self-belief and understanding our skills and barriers to learning.

LAMDA

Several of our students have taken their LAMDA exams recently. LAMDA Acting exams are performance-based qualifications offered by the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art (LAMDA). They assess a student's ability to perform and understand dramatic texts, with a focus on interpretation, technique, and knowledge of performance theory.

Students have to prepare 2 duologues which must be memorised and performed from published plays. As part of the exams, they must answer questions about the context of the play(s), the character's objectives and emotions, performance choices (voice, movement, pace, etc.) and an understanding of dramatic techniques. They must display skills which showcase voice modulation, diction, and projection, use of space and physicality and character development and emotional connection.

We are pleased to share that our students achieved some fantastic results!

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme (<u>https://www.westsussex.gov.uk/education-</u> <u>children-and-families/support-for-families/holiday-activities-and-food-programme/</u>) provides children who are eligible for benefits related Free School Meals (FSM) access to a wide range of activities and free nutritious meals over the school holidays.

Free School Meals (FSM)

Is my child eligible?

Free school meals in all West Sussex maintained and free schools and academies are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
