Basic Pool Safety



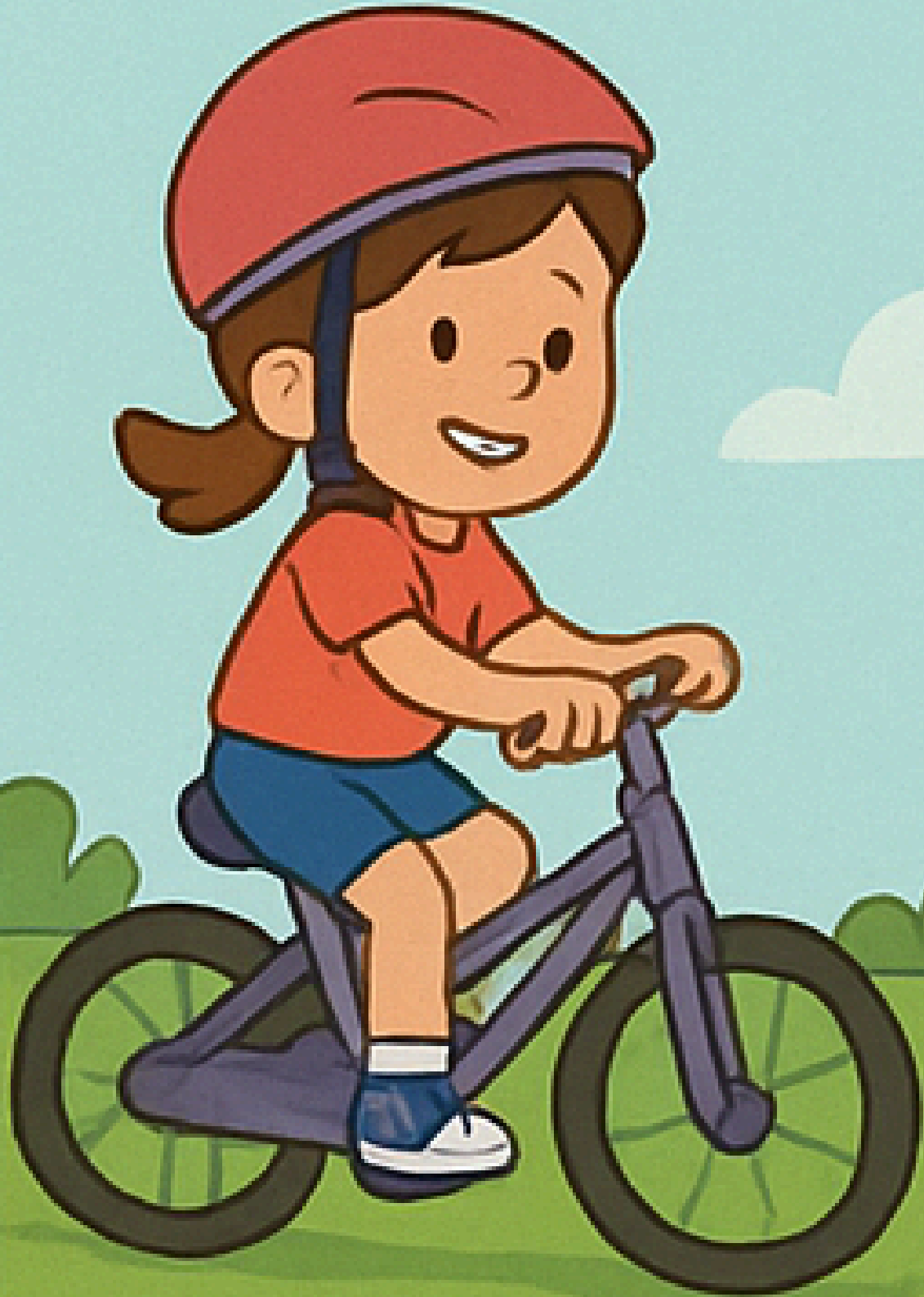
- Always swim with an adult
- Wear a life jacket
- Stay away from drains and other pool equipment
- Always follow pool rules
- Never swim alone

Stranger Danger



- Never talk to strangers
- Always ask a trusted adult before going anywhere with someone
- If you feel uncomfortable, tell an adult you trust.
- Walk or bike in groups
- Practice 'No' and 'Run' if someone tries to grab you—then tell an adult immediately

Summer Activities



- Drink plenty of water
- Wear a helmet when riding your bike, scooter, or skateboard
- Be aware of your surroundings and play safely with others
- If you see an adult or a friend who is hurt, ask for help right away

Fire Safety



- Do not start a fire on your own
- Don't play with fire
- Never play with matches or lighter
- If you see a fire, tell an adult
- An outdoor fire should always be in a fire pit or fire ring
- Do not play around a fire
- Do not throw anything in a fire

Medication Safety



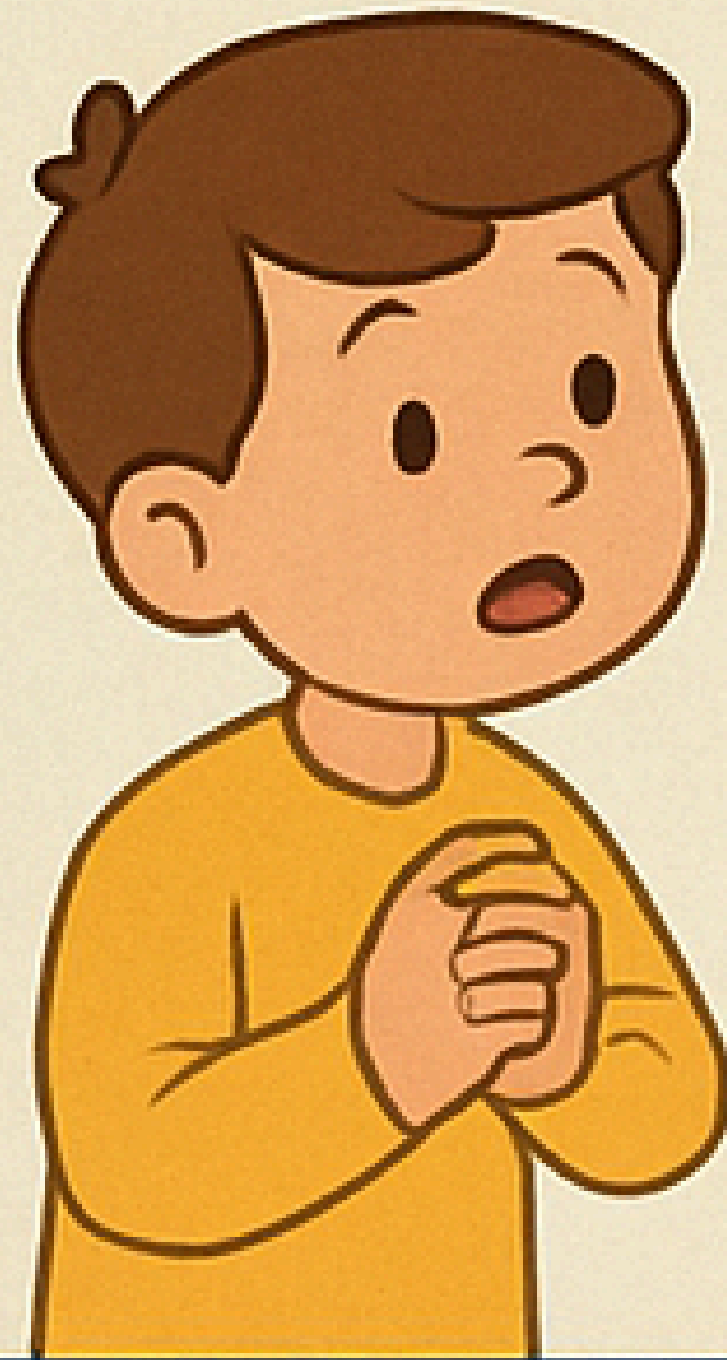
- Always ask an adult to help you take medicine
- Never take medicine on your own
- If you see medicine left out, don't touch it and tell an adult
- Don't share medicine with anyone
- If you accidentally take medicine, tell an adult right away

Online Safety



- An adult should be in the room with you when you are on technology
- Always ask an adult to get on a device
- Never share your name with someone online
- Use technology appropriately
- If you see something online that makes you uncomfortable, tell a trusted adult

Severe Weather Safety



- Stay indoors during storms
- If you hear thunder, go inside
- Know where the safest spot is in your home for severe weather



- Never touch a gun if you see one—immediately leave the area and tell an adult.
- If you find a gun, don't touch it—tell an adult or call for help right away.
