Organizations (Resources in Science Education) to offer your child an adventure in learning and exploration they will remember for a life-time! This unique experience will take them beyond the four walls of their classroom and into the great outdoors with their family and friends.





This exciting initiative offers your child the opportunity to become an official Field Research Ranger of the Palm Beach County School District. To become a Field Research Ranger your child must follow these steps:

- 1. Visit at least 10 participating RISE organizations
- 2. Complete the on-site Field Research Ranger activity
- 3. Bring the stamped passport booklet to the district office to receive their certification and the official Field Research Ranger patch.

This learning adventure is **FREE** for participating students, however, some participating state parks may require a minimal entrance fee that can not be waived according to policies set forth by the state.

By completing the Field Research Ranger certification process your child will experience nature walks, scavenger hunts, geocaching, and a variety of other hands-on learning activities supporting science and the discovery of Florida's natural resources and unique ecosystems. This opportunity has no time restriction and is available year-round so it can be a great weekend activity during the school year or a summer-long adventure.

## **PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Download the Passport document and open it.
- 2. Select Print icon and set preferences to "Print on both sides of the paper." 3. Be sure printer preferences are also set to "Flip on short edge" OR use other setting configurations depending on the printer to ensure that it prints properly.

- 4. \*Print as a front-to-back landscape image with all logos right side up on each page.
- 5. With printed pages evenly stacked, carefully cut along cover page center line (dotted line).
- 6. Place cover half-stack on top of the bottom half-stack, match corners of booklet, and fold. 7. Crease firmly and staple (2) along seam for durability.

\*Note—if printer configuration is problematic- print/cut/staple to create a logo booklet.
